North End Water

This matter of the North End water supply, whether the fluid is always below par in quality or is only at times, whether it is so bad that it is a health hazard or is only a nuisance or not nearly so bad as it sometimes looks, or even whether it is substantial enough to be actually noxious—and on the way to call for something in the way of a long range look.

Water supply and sewage disposal at the North End are in the hands of a private corporation and to the profitable end of the associated services—the supply of water for domestic, industrial and fire-fighting purposes—on the other and unprofitable end, the disposal of sewage, in the hands of a chartered district. In the course of the year the water service corporation has collected a very handsome total of profit from the people of that part of the town, while sewage disposal has been conducted wholly at the cost of the taxpayers of the district, who are the same people who have paid the profits to the corporation.

Meantime the rest of the town has got away from the need to pay private profits on its water supply and has installed both services, the providing of water and the disposal of sewage, as the common business of the community as a whole.

It is an anomalous situation that, in one part of Manchester, if there should appear an inadequacy in the water or sewer service, the people would have it in their power to correct the situation by choosing an administrator pledged to change it; while in another part of the town, if an unsatisfactory water condition develops, there is nothing whatever that the people can do about it; that it is entirely up to the corporation whether it shall or shall not do the things necessary for a better water supply.

All in the same town. It is a very unhappy circumstance that Manchester, in its beginnings, consisted of several more or less isolated villages, each of which went its own way and which were separated both by considerable distances and by lack of any solidarity of sentiment. It was this separation of its various communities that led to such things as the creation of separate fire, school and utility districts.

Manchester "Rest" Spots

We are beginning to be a bit impatient about the Merritt Parkway and its purposes. The project suggested itself, originally, Traffic conditions on the Boston Post Road from the Housatonic River to the New York State line had become a scandal. A parallel road simply had to be built. The beautiful scenic modern highway was a development out of a highly emergent necessity.

As it developed the project became more and more grandiose. Huge sums of money were allocated. This opened the way for a lot of graft. Astronomical prices were paid for necessary rights-of-way for a great deal of land not in any way needed for the great parkway which had displaced the mere highway originally planned. Now it is proposed to sell off some of this surplus land so that the state may recoup part of the huge sum spent on the project.

Makes a Difference

The murder of Dr. Walter Engelberg, secretary of the German consulate at New York, in his Brooklyn residence, while capable of being viewed as a simple mystery, is so evidently without indications of political significance that the German embassy at Washington has shown little interest in it. The embassy attitude seems to be that it is purely a police matter and one concerning objections possible to imagine in connection with the Merritt Parkway through a highly scenic area and that, instead of disposing of the various scenic tracts along its route, the state should acquire those lands and convert them into rest spots, picnic parks, where the nature lover may escape from the motor to a more contemplative beauties of nature.

That is where we got all mixed up. You build a carefully engineered and for a private corporation as the sole purpose of letting the motorist tear through like the hammers of hell, from Byram River to the Housatonic and then devote large spaces of expensive land to provide refuges for these desperately hurried creatures to loaf in.

What on earth are the motorists like on the Merritt Parkway for? Why is anybody on the Merritt Parkway, ever, unless it be to get somewhere in the smallest possible number of seconds?

For the contemplative, leisurely motorist there are other ways of getting from one place to another, but the motorist who is not so fastidious as to be content with a good road, but who is looking for an excitement to maul somebody or not.

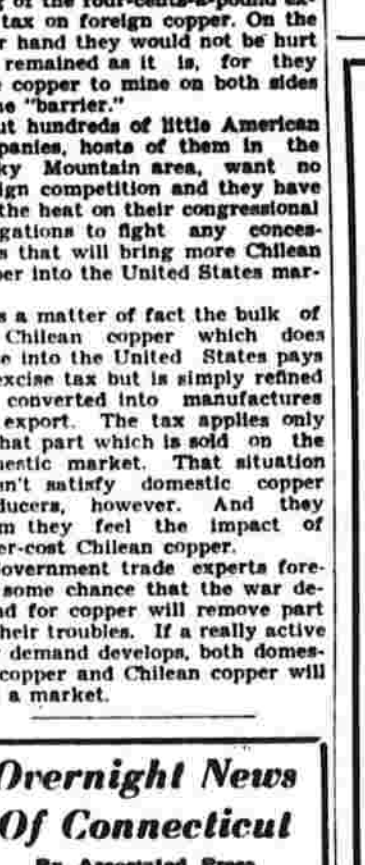

Disease and Insects Struck Hard in State

New Haven, Dec. 7.—Twenty-eight diseases and 18 insects seriously damaged vegetable crops on Connecticut farms in 1939, reported Director W. L. State of the Agricultural Experiment Station at New Haven, in the Annual Convention of the Connecticut Vegetable Growers' Association here today. Many of these troubles were not on any one farm. Many of them have been studied at the station and may be satisfactorily controlled, he said.

The director cautioned growers that new diseases, common elsewhere, might appear in this state, and gave reports for the several station departments working on problems affecting vegetable crops.

The survey of diseases and insects was undertaken and severity, the rise and fall of old pests, he said. This information is used as a basis for future studies. A radical difference appeared between the late 1938, wet year, and 1939, a drought season, showing the influence of weather.
