School Board Puts Off Union School Razing

Meeting Postponed Until Next Spring; Opinion As to Board's Rights Received from Counsel

The committee of the Union School Board which met last night at the meeting last night on the matter has been before the board for consideration for several weeks and has been given attention at three previous meetings.

At the meeting last night the board authorized Superintendent H. H. Hyde as to the right of the board in the matter, some feeling the opinion that it would be necessary to take the question to the next meeting.

Hyde in his report to the board at the meeting last night said that the school board has the right to discontinue the use of the Union School and to lease the building to the city.

Hyde also said that the city is willing to give several figures which would show what the city would pay for the building if given the contract.

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**Safe Driving Test  
A Good Xmas Gift**

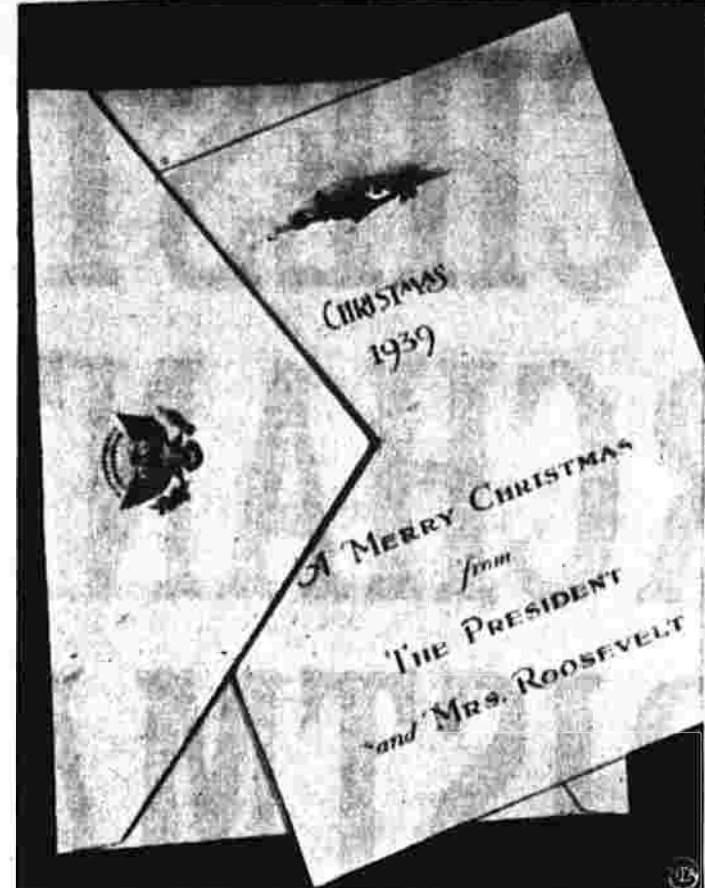
If you are planning to give your son or daughter an automobile for Christmas, says John J. Hall, safety division director of the National Conservation Bureau, make certain you add something that will insure it remains the cause of pleasure rather than of accident and death—the inculcation of a safe driving attitude.

"Parents contemplating such a gift," said Mr. Hall, "should do more than simply have the boy or girl who is reaching maturity demonstrate ability to manipulate an automobile efficiently, which includes a knowledge of the traffic laws of the state and of the city where most of the driving is to be done.

"Second: reach an agreement that the car will be used only until such time as the driver violates a law or is involved in an accident. A summons for an infraction of a traffic law should be sufficient for parents to suspend or revoke use of the car.

"Third: the parent should supply a list of safe-driving suggestions which the young driver should be pledged to follow. Parents who are experienced drivers can make out their own lists, which should include reasons for moderation in speed, driving only when in possession of all facilities, having consideration for pedestrians, particularly children, and maintaining brakes and other essential safety equipment in good condition at all times."

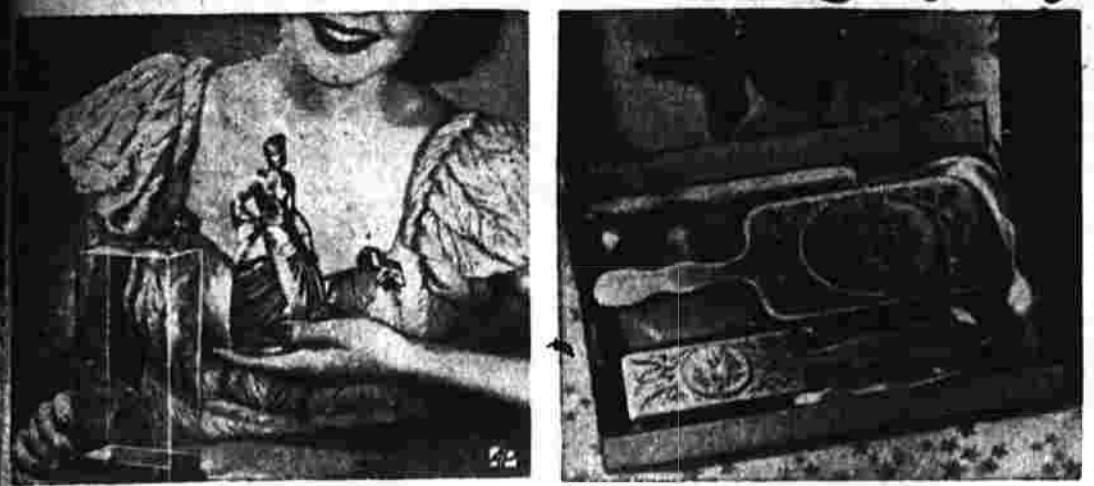

### Parents Urged To Talk Safety

Can Aid Safety Bureau By Stressing Value of Observing Rules.

Parents can be of real help to school teachers in furthering safety education by bringing to the attention of their children, regularly and frequently, the points and sometimes fatal consequences which may result from careless and thoughtless acts, according to Kenneth N. Beadle, education director of the National Conservation Bureau, accident prevention division of the Association of Casualty and Surety Executives.

Mr. Beadle, who in the past year has lectured on safety education methods to more than 15,000 school supervisors, teachers and school superintendents, and representatives of parent-teacher organizations throughout the country, gives this seasonal advice to parents everywhere:

"The schools are doing an increasingly effective job of keeping children safe while at school and habits that will help them to live safely through life. The home can cooperate to make the school program more successful by continuing to emphasize the constant need for watchfulness on the part of children."

"What should the parent stress? It is not necessary that the mother or father go into a long list of do's and don'ts, or lecture the child every time he or she goes out to play. But the parent can emphasize certain things that children do which lead to accidents."

"In cities these should particularly include: playing games in the roadway, careless bicycle riding, hitching on trucks, buses and trolley cars, and roller skating in the roadway. These can be called the most dangerous kinds of games in urban areas, and the child can be trained to recognize the possibility of danger when engaging in any of these activities."

"In the country the most dangerous activities are coasting on sleds, bicycle riding, and running across the highway. Every year hundreds of children meet death or injury from these three causes. The wise father and mother can help keep their children from injury by making them conscious of these dangers while playing."

"A high school principal recently had a fourth year class list all the serious accidents that they had personally experienced. The teachers as well as the parents were shocked to find that 28 children out of a class of 34 had been severely injured and bore scars or scars or handicaps resulting from accidents."

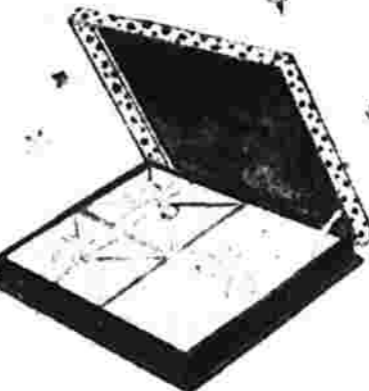

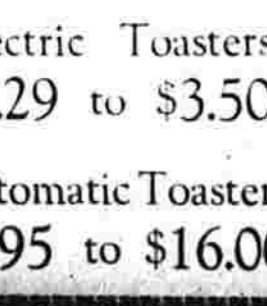
