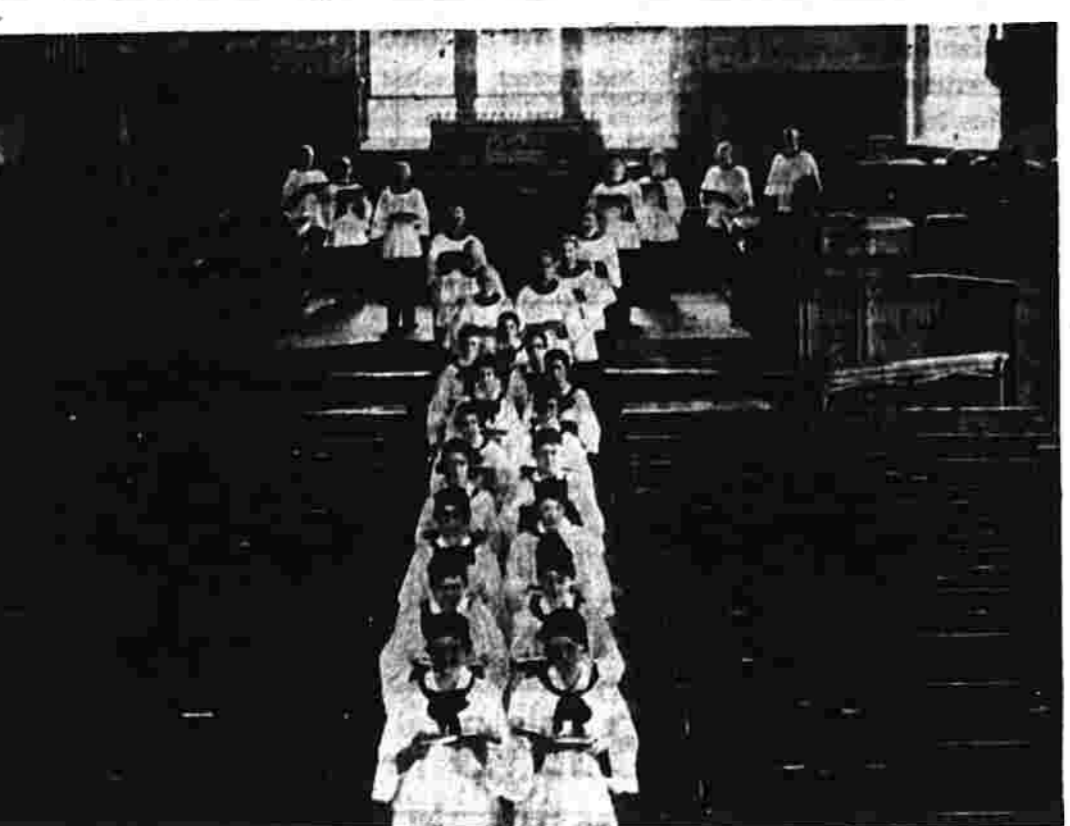

New Process for Making Cloth Seen Boon to South
