Washington, Dec. 22.—President Roosevelt said today he was considering a plan whereby the Federal government would build small hospitals in states and localities too poor to provide health facilities themselves.

The chief executive, discussing his national health program at a press conference, said the bill of Senator Harrison (D-Min) providing for Federal matching of state funds in hospital and school construction would be too costly and would discriminate against poorer states.

Finns Pursue Soviet Forces in Retreat; Called Catastrophe

Watches Report Russian in Vicinity of Salmijarvi, Point Retreated Passed in Southward Advance of the Past Week Before Movement Reversed; Retreat Is Toward East.

Copenhagen, Dec. 22.—(AP)—Retreating Soviet border points today described a Russian retreat in Arctic Finland as approaching the magnitude of a "catastrophe."

Watches on the frontiers said the southernmost Russian Arctic forces now were in the vicinity of Salmijarvi, a point they were reported to have passed in their southward advance of the past week before the movement reversed.

The Arctic highway at that point swings eastward, and other reports said the main direction of the Russian retreat was eastward toward the Kola, instead of northward toward the Finnish port of Petsamo.

Soviet transport ships, previously stationed at Petsamo when the Arctic push began more than three weeks ago, were said now to have departed for Petsamo.

The weather was calm and clear but the extreme cold continued. Retreating troops were observed from the frontiers seeking to bring their heavy equipment to the rear.

MotORIZED troops were in for a short distance, then jumped into the rear for a while for warmth. It was considered significant that southernmost Russian trucks had not been observed in the last two days nor any other indication of movement.

How to Rid the Home Of Food Eating Insects

Editor's Note:—This is the second in a series of articles on household pest preparation for the American people by the Connecticut agricultural experiment station.

New Haven, Dec. 22.—Cook roaches are another kind of food-eating insect that worry housekeepers. They come from dumps or food storage houses, migrate or are carried into homes, apartments and stores, breed unnoticed until they build up a population and then cause considerable trouble.

They live on approximately the same diet as most they eat. They eat great deal more food than they consume. According to Kovie, from an entomologist in charge of work with insects invading buildings at the agricultural experiment station. When roaches have been running over food they have become contaminated with a characteristic odor that is very disagreeable. Mr. Turner says, "Although roaches are not a health hazard, they are a pest because they are so numerous."

Mr. Turner describes three methods of control, recommending the first as best. It is to find out where they are feeding and exterminate them. This is done by spraying with DDT. The spray is effective for only one month and must be repeated every 24 hours, but they are a sure exterminating material.

The second method is to use bait. This is done by placing bait in long strips. This type of bait has become much more common in the last few years. Usually large numbers are found only where conditions are very unsanitary.

But for the Russians... In today's reports from the Finnish war in the Arctic, even approximately reflect the actual situation in the far north, there appears to be more than a slight chance that the Russian army will only be swept out of every foot of the Finnish territory they have gained in that region but may lose their entire northern empire.

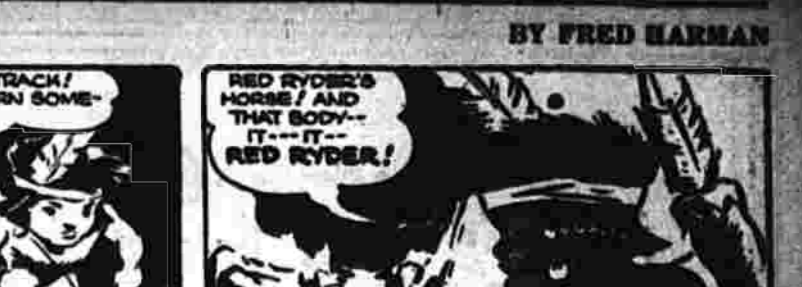
