



Renew Air Raids
Copenhagen, Dec. 23 (A) Solider Russian bombers were reported today to have renewed air raids on Finnish cities shortly after midnight for the fifth successive day.

Unconfirmed reports reaching here said bombs had fallen on the Finnish seaports of Turku (Abo) and Pori and the ammunitions centered to the Christmas season.
