Convict Freed; No Real Clues

Fort Towson, Okla., Jan. 3.—(AP)—Massacration of a convict in the violent New Year's Eve deaths of Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Rogers and their 4-year-old son, Dean, left investigators with no definite clues.

The convict, a cook at a nearby prison camp, was questioned by County Attorney Norman Horton and Warden Jess Dunn after he had been implicated by a trusty at Stratton's sup-prison.

Dunn said a coroner's investigation convinced him the convict had been shot in a "rage." He discounted a report that the convict had been drinking and said he was attending a party at the time.

The coroner's report partially substantiated the story of James Rogers, 32, 2nd street, who said he shot his mother and father and then fired their three-room house.

Dunn said he carried out the investigation with his brother, Billie Dunn.

Dr. E. A. Johnson said he found bloodstains in the bodies of Mr. and Mrs. Rogers and that they apparently died of burns.

Purge Leaders, Murphy Urges

New Hampshire Governor wants G. O. P. to return to ideals.

Worcester, Mass., Jan. 3.—(AP)—What the Republican party needs, in the opinion of New Hampshire's Republican governor, is a purge of "unhealthy leadership" and "return to the party to the common people."

"At the present time," he asserted in an address before the Worcester County Republican club last night, "the three recognized aspirants of our party are traveling in three different directions. This condition has brought about a situation where, already, the road has been planned of a third party."

Urging the G. O. P. to have its campaign upon the recent Republican records of achievement, rather than upon "useless criticism," Murphy said "it is foolish for a Republican leader to say the New Deal is absolutely wrong when many developments it has sponsored are good."

Crying for leadership based upon practical experience, which understands the problems of worker and producer alike, which appreciates the evil effects of restricting business and which appreciates that public budgets must be balanced and governmental costs placed upon a reasonable basis.

"There are strong indications that those who make use of wealth for wealth's sake are once again attempting to dominate legislation in legislative halls of either state or nation, who never experience a single day amidst problems of executive administration of state and nation, and who cannot by any stretch of the imagination be assumed to have knowledge of the problems of the vast national administration will be called upon to solve."

"For seven years I have been contributing my mite to purge the Republican party of unhealthy leadership based upon religious bigotry, to cast aside the selfish professional politicians who threaten to return the party to the common people."
