### Urges Improved Services In State's Health Dept.

**Hartford, Jan. 10.—**To meet the needs of a population of 24,000,000, the Bureau of Laboratories of the State Department of Health, in a report, urged that the health department be reorganized and that the services be improved.

The report, which is the first of a series of reports on the health department, was prepared by a committee of the State Department of Health, headed by Dr. J. H. Harkness, director of the department.
