British Coal Production Up

London, Jan. 17.—It is an ill wind that blows nobody good, and by a same token, some 80,000 British men and their families have found that even a terrible European war has done them the immense service of making them busy workmen, instead of mere idle hands, counting the long list of days with nothing to do but loaf.

The men referred to are coal miners. Their trade has been in the past ten years, one of the hardest hit in Britain. The coal mine regions have been among the most terribly "depressed areas."

There are men who have been on relief more years than they care to number. Now a mighty effort is being made by the government, the coal mining companies and the miners to secure an immense increase in the coal production of Great Britain. It is an essential war measure.

There is plenty of coal already mined here. The mines that have been closed for some time can produce even more. In fact, it is hoped to re-employ all the 80,000 idle miners. Before the present time yearly output of coal in Britain has been 200,000,000 tons. It is hoped to increase this by 40,000,000 tons a year.
