This startling change, however, is achieved with a certain astuteness rather than blind expediency. It comes on the eve of the expiration of the Japanese treaty with Manchuria, and it is believed that the vital trade treaty was denounced by Washington six months ago, to expire this month.

The Japanese have made it entirely plain that they intend to stay in China unless they are blasted out. They plan to control the Chinese government, and to keep all the chief economic endeavors in their own hands to the exclusion of foreigners. Japanese civilians are pouring into Manchuria in an effort to influence the conquest.

The open door policy, of course, the great stumbling block to Japanese expansion, is highly important to Washington. It is highly probable that Tokyo will recede much from the policy of exclusion which has carried Japan so far on the continent of China. What concessions Nippon is prepared to make to regain American approval remains to be seen.

Trio Jailed For Perjury Local Youths Get Time As Result of False Court Testimony

Three local youths, charged with perjury in testimony they offered in an assault case early this week, were sentenced to jail today in town court by Judge Raymond H. Bowers. In pronouncing his sentence, Judge Bowers stated that the offense was one of great seriousness with a state prison term of six months punishment. Washington, Jan. 18.—The Washington Social Security Board would like to see more pay go out for a longer period to men who lose their jobs. It is another way of saying the board favors a change in the unemployment compensation laws along the lines of an amendment proposed by Representative McCormack (D., Mass.), and approved by the American Federation of Labor.

That amendment, which McCormack is likely to hear before Congress goes home, would provide 30 weeks of benefits after a man loses his job. It would increase the minimum of \$8 a week up to a maximum of \$24 a week. Only one week of pay would be paid for the first week after he loses his job before he starts to draw benefits.

Under the present laws, he waits two weeks or longer before beginning to draw benefits—except in Texas, which has cut the waiting period to one week. He draws these benefits an average of ten weeks, or ranging from six or seven weeks up to a maximum of 15 weeks. He draws anywhere from \$2 to \$10 a week.

The present law is designed to liberalize the unemployment compensation laws. The states are developing a huge reserve fund. It stands now at a billion and a half dollars.
