### **British Blame** U. S. Shippers For All Delays

Reluctance to Cooperate In Giving Advance Information on Cargoes Is Responsible.

London, Jan. 23-(A)-A spokesnan for the Ministry of Economic Variare said today that the relucance of American shippers to cooperate in supplying advance information and guarantees concerning their cargoes was responsible for delays in passing U. S. ships through British contraband con-trol stations.

Referring to complaints by the United States government that American ships were being detain-ed at contraband control points an

ed at contraband control points an average of 1' 4 days-three times as long as Italian vessels—the spokesman said these additional points figured in the situation: Italian ships for the most part carry bulk cargoes, whereas American cargoes often include as nany as 300 items, thus requiring a longer time for examination; American ships usually touch at various ports all around the Medi-terranean, whereas the Italiana are going only to Italy.
