British Blame U. S. Shippers For All Delays

Reluctance to Cooperate In Giving Advance In- formation on Car- goes Is Responsible.

London, Jan. 23.—A spokesman for the Ministry of Economic Warfare said today that the reluctance of American shippers to cooperate in supplying advance information and guarantees concerning their cargoes was responsible for delays in passing U. S. ships through British contraband control stations.

Referring to complaints by the United States government that American ships were being detained at contraband control points an average of 14 days—three times as long as Italian vessels—the spokesman said these additional points figured in the situation:

Italian ships for the most part carry bulk cargoes, whereas American cargoes often include as many as 500 items, thus requiring a longer time for examination; American ships usually touch at various ports all around the Mediterranean, whereas the Italians are going only to Italy.

The American objection to the British procedure applies especially to the Mediterranean area and the Gibraltar control point.

Objects To Treatment.

United States Secretary of State Cordell Hull in a diplomatic communication addressed to the British ambassador, Lord Lichfield, last Saturday objected to "discriminatory treatment of American ships in the Mediterranean. He expressed his government's "serious concern" over the situation.

Today the British spokesman cited the case of two American ships. He said the *Esamalia* arrived at Gibraltar Sunday without any advance information on the cargo having been submitted and added that none had been received up to today.

Similarly, said the spokesman, the Ministry of Economic Warfare had not received a "hold back" guarantee by the shipper to the destination until it had been examined by British agents or until assurance has been given that it is not going to Germany.

The United States liner *Washington*, on the other hand, arrived at Gibraltar Saturday and sailed in 12 hours as a result of a "hold back" arranged through agents the day before her arrival, the spokesman said.

Shippers Cooperating To Amazing Extent

Washington, Jan. 23.—In formal statement that American shippers are reluctant to cooperate in the British contraband control, State Department officials made this triple comment today:

1. American shippers are cooperating to an amazing extent to avoid unpleasant incidents.
2. They are not obliged to cooperate at all.
3. Possible lack of cooperation does not excuse the British for undue detention of American ships.

Officials listed cooperation by shippers as embracing application to British authorities for navigation certificates, supplying copies of their manifests (lists of cargo) by air mail, and giving expedited black diamond guarantees, which are promises not to dis-

Shanghai, Jan. 23.—The terms of a tentative peace agreement between Japan and Wang Ching-wei, former Chinese premier, which would grant Japan most of the objectives for which she invaded China were disclosed today by sources close to Wang.

Japan would get economic dominance over China and sweeping military and political rights in several important special areas.

Wang, ousted from the Chiang Kai-shek regime and from Chinese Nationalist party offices a year ago, was chosen Jan. 8 by the Japanese cabinet to head a new central government which the Japanese intend to establish in the Japanese-occupied sections of China.

Receiving No Guarantees

The terms also disclosed today indicate that Wang is yielding much Japan while receiving no guarantees.

Informants said that a formal peace accord has not yet been concluded, but a gentlemen's agreement already has been signed.

The principal terms as disclosed today include:

Recognition of the Japanese conquest of Manchoukuo.

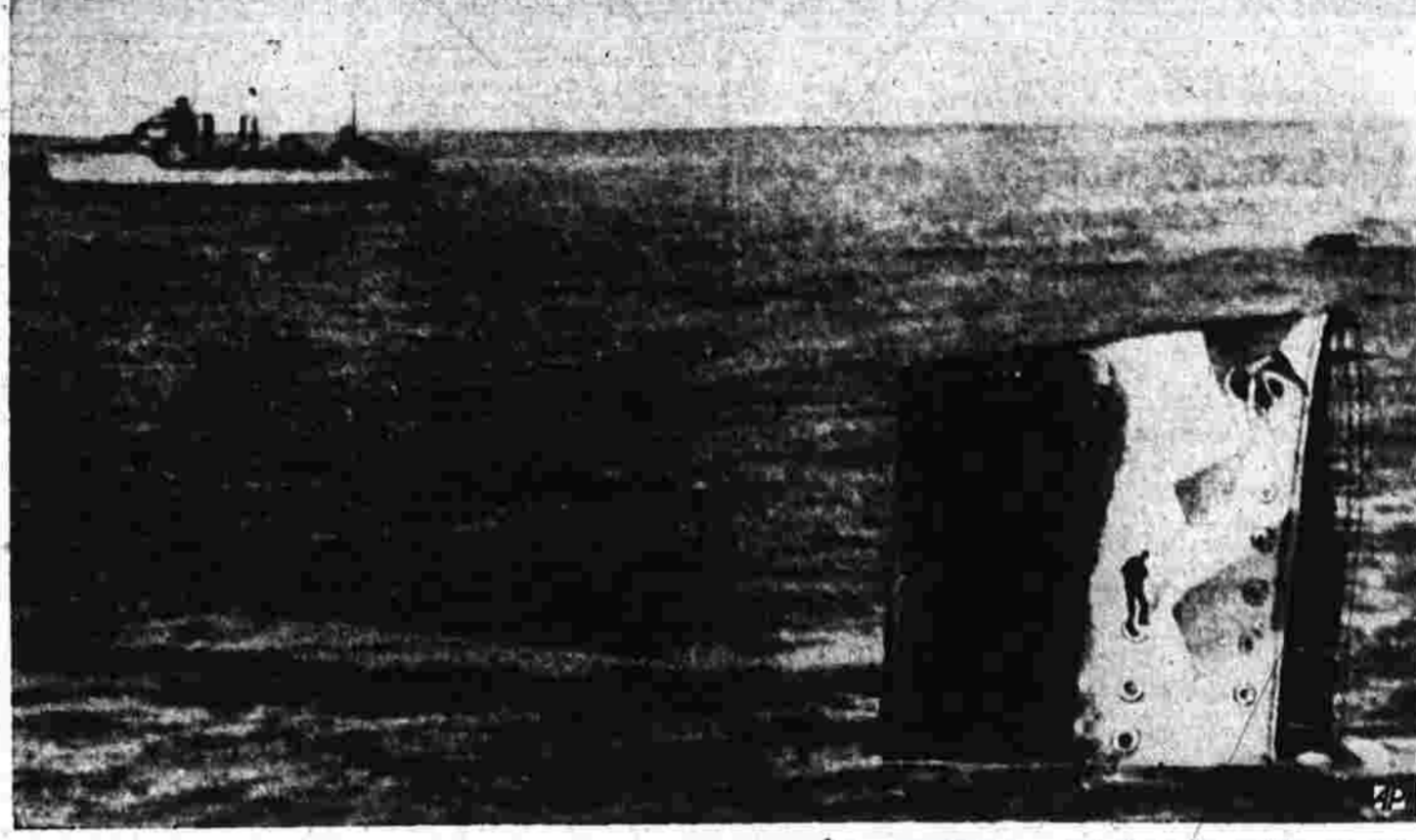

British, French Warning Follows Decree Creating Petroleum Com- mission for Control.

Bucharest, Jan. 23.—British and France today warned the Rumanian government that any attempt to compel British and French oil companies operating in Rumania to furnish oil for Germany would result in grave complications.

The warning followed a Rumanian decree creating a National Petroleum Commission with authority to control production, refining and export of all Rumanian oil "in conformity with the interests of the state."

Given Sweeping Powers

The decree gave the commission sweeping powers, including the right to take over companies not submitting to its orders.

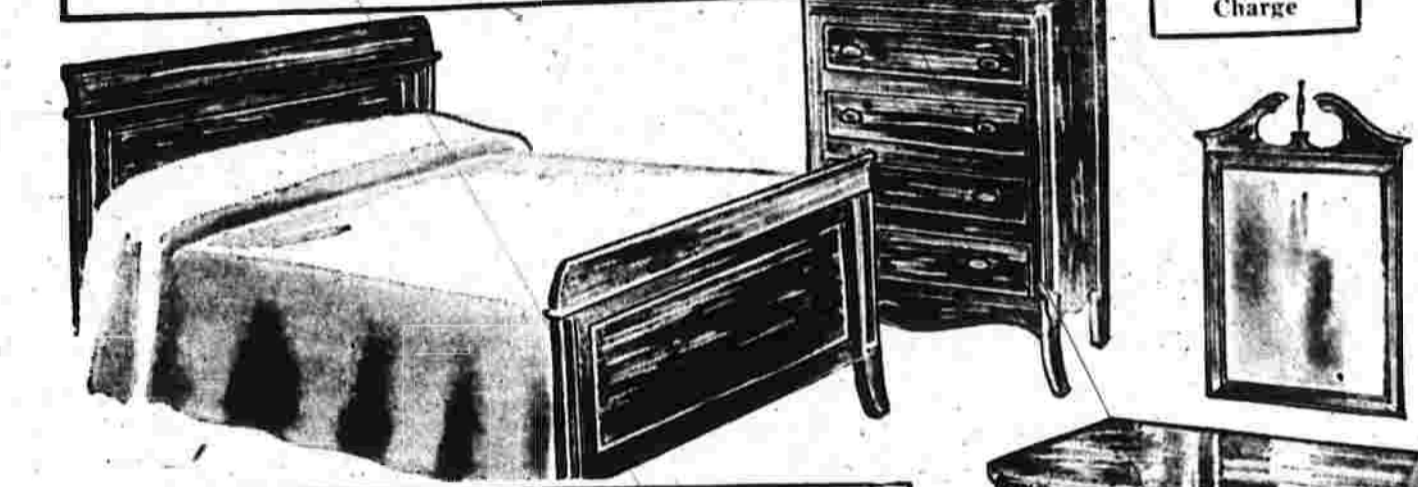

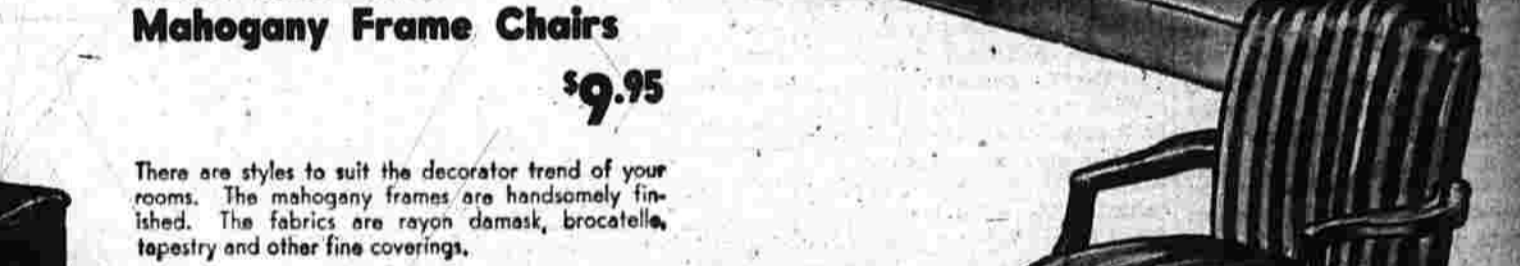

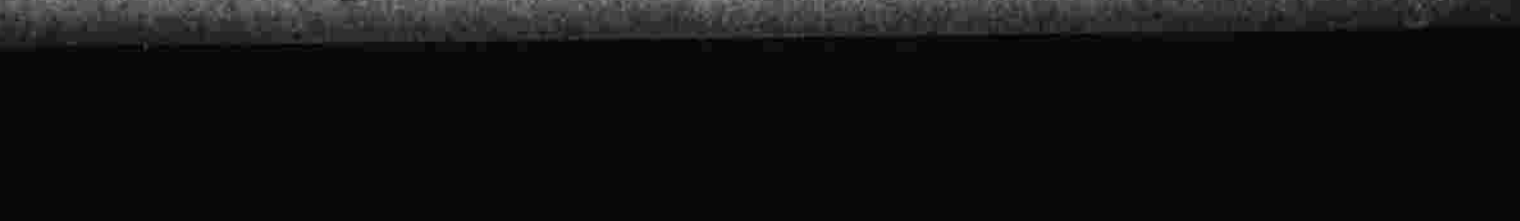
