2 Wars Of Words

THE big news in Moscow this week was the rescue of a shipload of Soviet scientists after 27 months adrift in a Polar ice jam.

Abroad

At Tientsin, in Japanese-occupied North China, Japan's army this week tightened the blockade it had thrown around the British and French concessions last June after accusing Britons there of harboring Chinese terrorists.

Officially, this was Japan's answer to activities of anti-Japanese elements within the concessions. But it coincided with Tokyo's demand on London for the return of 21 German seamen recently seized by a Japanese warship from a Japanese liner.

Tokyo was sore at Washington, too, for terminating the two-year-old trade treaty last week. Its expiration cleared the way for a similar U. S. embargo on shipments of war essentials to Japan.

Legislation empowering the President to take over the production of certain goods was urged on Congress this week by Charles Pittman, Republican Foreign Relations Committee.

Activities... Affected Nippon's new foreign minister, Hachiro Lida, announced that he was disclaiming any Japanese intention to eliminate the rights of foreign powers in the U. 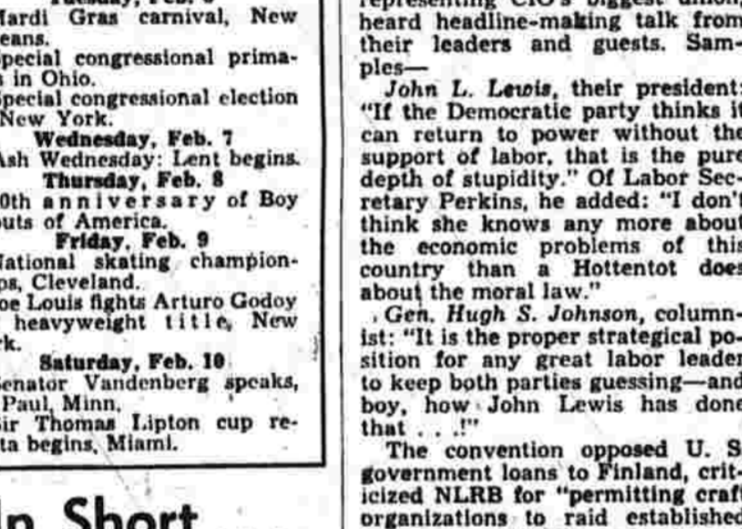

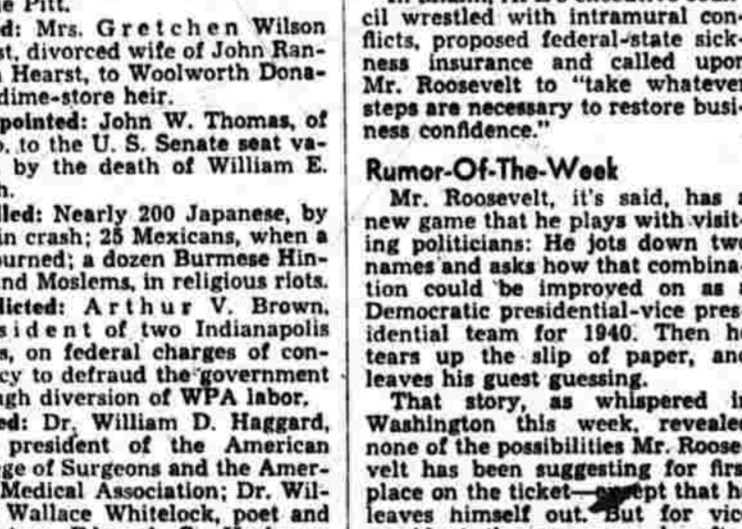

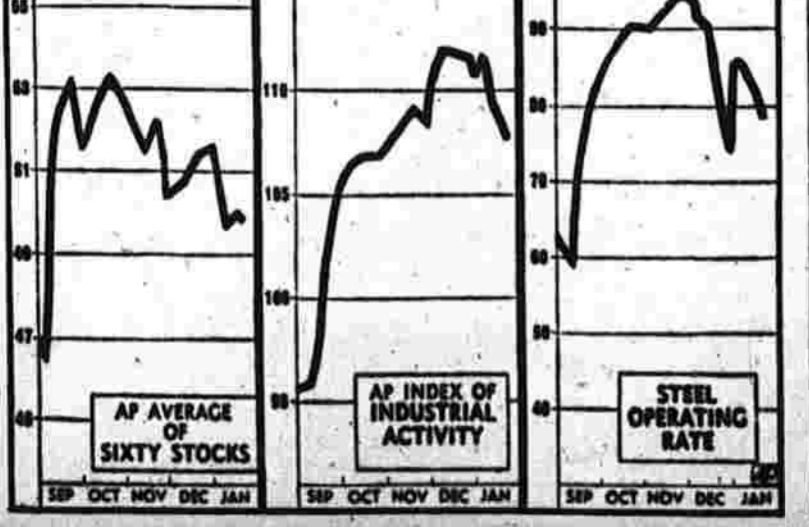
