Trade Pacts Battle Leads To Questions on Treaties

Washington, Feb. 19.—(P)— As to nations which have not signed Secretary Hull's fight to renew the reciprocal trade program comes to the House floor, more and more people are asking, "just what is a trade agreement?"

A. Yes. But the United States will give the same reductions to all other countries sending those goods to the United States who enjoy most-favored-nation treatment, and Britain will—
Q. Hold on! What do you mean by most-favored-nation treatment?
A. The United States will give the same reductions to all nations which do not discriminate against us but grant us the same tariffs they grant all other nations.
Q. Do we do that for all nations?
A. No. Germany is out, because she denounced the so-called most-favored-nation clause in our commercial treaty with her, and our government claims she is discriminating against American goods.
