





European War Tame In First Six Months

France have fought a war of attrition against Germany, content them her in and hurther eco-

Allied soldiers and 250,000 Germans killed at Ypres alone, and with the 70,000 Russians killed and wounded at Tannenberg.

The Naval war is largely a fight between Britain's great surface fieet and the submarines of Germany, although the French Navy, Europe's second largest, is effective in the blockade against Germany and has sunk some submarines. The Allies together claim to have destroyed about 50.

The only French warship acknowledged to have been lost was the mine-laying cruiser Pluton, sunk in an accidental explosion with a loss of 100 lives. The British, however, have lost 30 naval yessels, including 15 naval trawiers, and 2,602 officers and men who were killed and 69 taken prisoner.

Aside from the trawiers British Naval losses were one aircraft carlier, one battleship, one merchant ruiser, aix destroyers, four sub-


