Boston — New materials which now are virtually unknown will comprise "probably one-fourth of all textiles in use in this country" within five years, the Associated Industries of Massachusetts propheside recently in its annual report on mey products developed in the Bay State.

"The new textiles will not look or feel like anything we are now using," the report asserted. "They will probably be used first in women's garments, but many new fabries for men's wear will follow."




