Mayan Artists Invented Comic Strip "Balloons" THE modern comie artist, who first circled a group of words and drew a line down to the ndicate speech, may have though made a great discovery. ing 1500 years ago.

But far more important to the average Mayan than the speech scrolls carved upon temple walls, was the remarkably accurate calendar, pictured on the Gustemala stamp, above, one of a recent series of four low values. Upon this calendar depended the prepa-ration of fields, planting of seeds

and harvest.

The Mayan civilization developed in northern Guatemala during the early years of the Christian era, reached its peak about the eighth century and had almost disappeared when the Spaniards came to Mexico. The Mayan priest-astronomers based their chronology upon movement of planets, made it exact to a day within a period of 374,400 years, which is as accurate as the calen-dar Pope Gregory devised 1000 TOONERVILLE FOLKS


