Hartford, March 20.—(AP)—The Connecticut Supreme Court of Errors held constitutional today a statute making it a criminal offense to use methods of "birth control," and ruled that it was illegal for a physician to prescribe contraceptives even if he believed the "general health" of a married woman would be affected by pregnancy.
