Hull Rebukes

Cromwell Reprimanded For His Anti-German Speech at Toronto.

Washington, March 22-(P) James H. R. Cromwell, millionaire diplomat of two months' service as minister to Canada, has been reprimanded by Secretary of State Hull for the anti-German speech he delivered at Toronto.

The secretary used straightforward language last night in taking to task the husband of Doris Duke, "world's richest girl."

"Secretary Hull found," a State Department announcement said, "that the address contravened standing instructions to American diplomatic officers, as public discussions of controversial policies and was a former representation.

Public Reaction Divided
A sharp cleavage in public reaction to Crowwell's utterances was evident in the number of letters subsequently received at the State Department. About half of them criticized the minister, and the other half voiced approval of his statements.

The Toronto speech actually was the second to contain pro-ally statements. The first was made at Val D'Or, Canada, on Math 10.

Cromwell repeated that he believed "the Allies were fighting for the perpetuation of individual liberty and freedom" and voiced hopes for Allied victory.
