Werst Disturbance Knows.

The American Telephone and Telegraph Company said it was the worst case of wire disruption its engineers could recall. Currents as high as 500 volts were set up by the disturbance, causing insulation to burn in some instances.

The Associated Press's \$5,000-mile leased wire circuit was badly hit, as was its 10,000-mile wire-photo network over which news-pictures are transmitted.

At one time it was necessary to route a picture from New York to Boston, a distance of 250 miles over a circuit almost 15 times longer.

A belief that future occurrences might be predicted by a new sky camera called the "Coronograph" was offered by Dr. Donald H. Mingel, Harvard astronomer. He said recent observations had shown that coronal disturbances were followed a day later by a magnetic storm. Conversely, all the counties showed considerable progress in regaining their losses by 1937, the gains over 1933 ranging from 17.4 per cent in Providence to 108.8 per cent in the Detreit area. In general, all the 3,070 counties where wage-earners worked in industrial plans followed the same trend. It was discovered, however, that one-fourth of the nation's industrial plans were concentrated in only seven countles—centering on New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, Philadelphia, Brooklyn, Detroit and Boston. There were 216 countles without any manufacturing plants in operation during 1937.

Between 1933 and 1937, Los Angeles county stepped from fifth to third place in the number of manufacturing plants, and Wayne county (Detroit) Mich., rose from ninth to sixth.
