Paris was seething with hate

Paris was seething with hate and revolution for weeks before the fatal day. Mobs of unemployed, beggars, bandits and murderers roamed the streets.

On July 14 the fury of the mob broke. Arsenals were raided, the attack on the Bastille began. The commander of the fortress offered surrender, upon guarantee of the safety of the garrison. He and several officers were ruthlessly murdered. Although the dungeons were supposed to be filled with prisoners, only seven were found. The stamp pictured above was released in four values by each of 24 French colonies to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the French Revolution.


