

Arkley Sees No New Legislation Rest of Session

Arkley Sees No New Legislation Rest of Session. Expresses Hope Adjournment of Congress by June 1; Another Government Reorganization Plan May Be Given Solons.

Washington, April 1.—(AP)—Senator Barkley (D., Ky.), said after a White House conference today that "apparently no new legislation" would go to Congress this session, and added: "We still are hoping to get out of here by June 1, if not sooner."

Adjournment of Congress was mentioned casually, added the Democratic leader, at the usual Monday morning meeting of President Roosevelt and congressional chiefs. Vice-President Garner, Speaker Bankhead and House Majority Leader Rayburn (D., Texas), also attended.

Another Reorganization Plan Barkley told reporters another government reorganization plan might be submitted to Congress this week and he believed it would involve intra-departmental changes. He predicted it would not affect the Forest Service.

No final date for adjournment can be agreed upon, at this stage of the process, said the Kentucky Democrat.

In the House, Representative Cochran (D., Mo.) said in a statement that he did not see how Congress could refuse to increase the \$1,000,000,000 proposed for WPA in President Roosevelt's budget for the 1940-41 fiscal year.

Cochran urged more money also for the current year ending June 30, said he was advised by Col. F. C. Harrington, WPA administrator. That \$88,000,000 would be needed to keep WPA rolls at their present level of 2,100,000 during May and June.

To Appear Tomorrow Harrington is scheduled to appear before the House Subcommittee tomorrow. Today, Representative Voorhis (D., Calif.) introduced legislation to provide \$58,000,000 more for relief during the current year, saying this sum would permit WPA to stand at 2,300,000, the March level.

Star Salesman Of Vanco Firm Held in South

Sam Holtz, Sought Since Collapse of Company Is Arrested in Shreveport, La., Hickey Says.

Sam Holtz, alias Ben Harris, stock salesman, who has been sought in connection with the Vanco Company case in Manchester, N. H., was this afternoon apprehended in Shreveport, La., State Police Commissioner Edward J. Hickey announced late this afternoon.

The telegram received by Commissioner Hickey read as follows: "Sam Holtz, alias Ben Harris, apprehended at Shreveport, La. Holding him as your prisoner at Baton Rouge. Awaiting your officers arrival."

Holtz has been sought throughout the country since the death of W. W. Robertson on January 27. It is alleged he fraudulently disposed of stock in the Vanco Company of which Robertson was president.

Holtz had been connected with the sale of Vanco stock soon after the Connecticut Corporation was formed. He called on Manchester people, in most cases making the statement, it is said, that he had been sent at the request of William W. Robertson.

Shortly after the banking department started their investigation into the conditions of the Vanco Company Holtz left Manchester and did not again appear here after the trouble was discovered. It was discovered he had no certificate to sell stock in this state.

When he was not located, in the early part of the investigation, at his home in New York, it was thought that he had left that state. Search turned to the South where he was known to have friends.

The state police have been following his trail and an arrest warrant was sworn out by State Attorney Alcorn soon after the complaint was made to him.

The Japanese minister declared the announcement of United States Secretary of State Cordell Hull that the United States would not recognize the three-day-old government "can hardly be described as constructive."

Foreign Minister Hachiro Arta said yesterday at Osaka that continued United States recognition of the Chungking government of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek had been foreseen "in view of the American attitude since the outbreak of the Manchurian incident."

He said it would damage efforts to improve Japanese-United States relations.

Floods Take Lives of 10

Clearing Skies and Cooler Weather Give Promise of Relief.

By The Associated Press. Widely-separated sections of the nation were inundated today by spring floods which took 10 lives, but clearing skies and cooler temperatures for the most part gave promise of early relief.

South central New York state rivers—principally the Susquehanna and Chesapeake—spilled from their banks from melting snow and rains, forcing hundreds of families from their homes and blocking roads. Colder weather, however, promised to halt the rises.

Thousands of acres of northern California farm land along the Sacramento river were covered by flood waters for the second time in a month and scores of farm families were forced to seek higher ground. Clear weather was forecast after nearly a week of heavy rains.

Six were counted dead across Pennsylvania, and four in New York. Wilkes-Barre, Pa., prepared for a 34-foot crest—four above flood stage—some time early tomorrow. Flood control dikes, however, helped lessen the damage.

A state of emergency was declared at Binghamton, N. Y., threatened by above-flood stage crests expected late today. Seven hundred families were removed from low ground at Johnson City, N. Y.

Russia Plans Record Sum For Defense

57 Billion Rubles Budget Awaits Approval; Territory Won in Finn War Put Into Nation.

Moscow, April 1.—(AP)—A record defense budget totaling 57,000,000,000 rubles awaited approval today by Russia's Parliament, the Supreme Soviet, which yesterday incorporated into the U. S. S. R. the territory which the Red Army won from Finland in a bitter, 105-day war.

The defense appropriation, announced by Finance Commissar A. G. Zverev at an applauding Sunday session of the legislative body, exceeds by 16,115,000,000 rubles the amount appropriated for the same purpose last year.

The item was one of the largest single appropriations in the 1940 national budget, which anticipates revenues of 183,000,000,000 rubles for all purposes.

"The nominal value of the ruble is 20 cents, but the currency is not quoted in regular foreign exchange. Therefore there is no basis for an accurate conversion of the ruble in terms of the dollar."
