Hatay's Pictorials Were Republic's Last Issue THERE will be no more "Hata" two-year-old republic, originally carved out of Syria, shown on the carved out of Syria, shown on the map stamp above, became part of Turkey as the price France paid for the promise of Turkish assistance in the Near East.

The 1939 pictorial series of four designs and 13 values, and a postage due set of four values, comprise the principal philatelic issues of the short-lived republic. The first Hatay stamps were Syrian and Turkish overprints. The end of the republic is noted, philatelically, by overprints of a Turkish issue of 1930.

Hatay became independent under a treaty between France and Turkey in 1937. Turkey formally annexed the 3000-square mile nation of 250,000 people on July 23, 1939. Citizens were permitted to choose Syrian, Lebanese or Turkish citizenship. Those rejecting Turkey will be given 18 months to leave the area.
