

More than 4000 kilometers of railroad lines have been built, increasing Manchukuo's rail mileage to 10,000 kilometers. Most of Japan's dreams of a continental empire depend upon these railroads. Numerous feeder lines penetrate undeveloped agricultural and mining areas, to bring raw materials to the rapidly grow-ing industrial centers. 
