Washington, April 12.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, discussing criticism of his fourth government reorganization plan, stressed today that the work of the Civil Aeronautics Authority and its Air Safety Board would be under the Commerce Department.

Under the reorganization plan, the Air Safety Board was abolished and the CAA transferred to Secretary of Commerce Hugh S. Green.

Senator McCarran (D-Nev.), co-author of the act creating the CAA, said he would fight the reorganization plan on the ground it would deprive the agency of its independence.
