**Objective Still Peace at Home and Abroad, President Tells Senate, Solemn Joint Session of Senate and House; Warplane Program Put Forward by Executive As Long Range Goal.**

Washington, May 16.—(AP)—An air armada of 50,000 warplanes was advocated by President Roosevelt today in a personally delivered message to Congress asking a \$1,182,000,000 emergency national defense program. "Our ideal, our objective is still peace—peace at home and peace abroad," Mr. Roosevelt told a tense and solemn joint session of the Senate and House. "Nevertheless, we stand ready not only to spend millions for defense, but to give our services and even our lives for the maintenance of our American liberties."

The huge warplane program was put forward by the Chief Executive as a long range goal. His immediate recommendations, Mr. Roosevelt said, were to spend \$1,182,000,000 for the construction of 50,000 warplanes in readiness for action. Opening debate on a \$975,000,000 WPA bill before President Roosevelt arrived to deliver an extraordinary defense message, Cannon said.

"Here is the situation. Under present scheduled of \$1,000,000,000 we are employing 2,000,000 men. If we curtail the program, we shall be losing 1,300,000 men. In other words, we would have 700,000 workers in America. "No radical a transition would be most disastrous," Cannon pleaded with the members to agree to President Roosevelt's request that he be permitted to spend the \$975,000,000 in 1940, if necessary, in his budget message last year, Mr. Roosevelt recommended that the amount be full 12-month period starting July 1.

"The defense program has been a period in history when conditions changed as fast as since that day after the war," Cannon said. "We abroad has depressed unemployment. There is no market left."

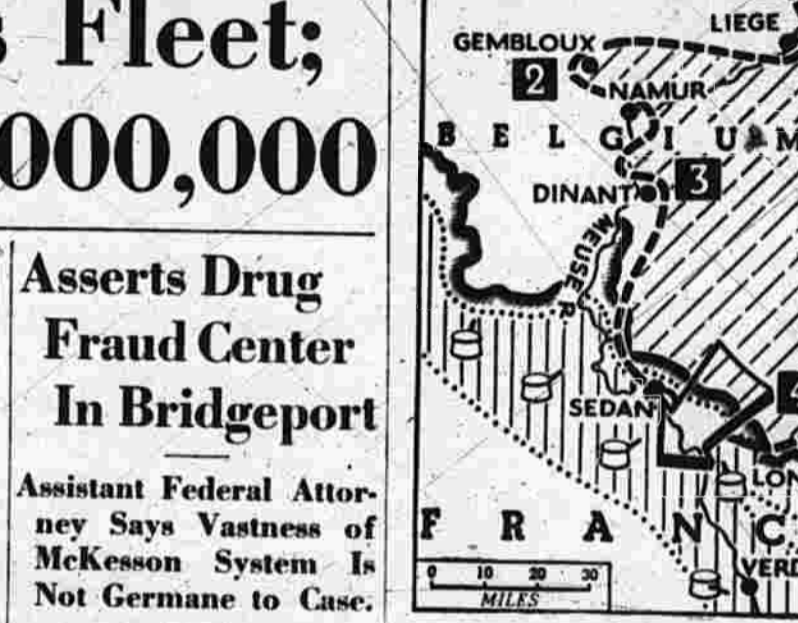

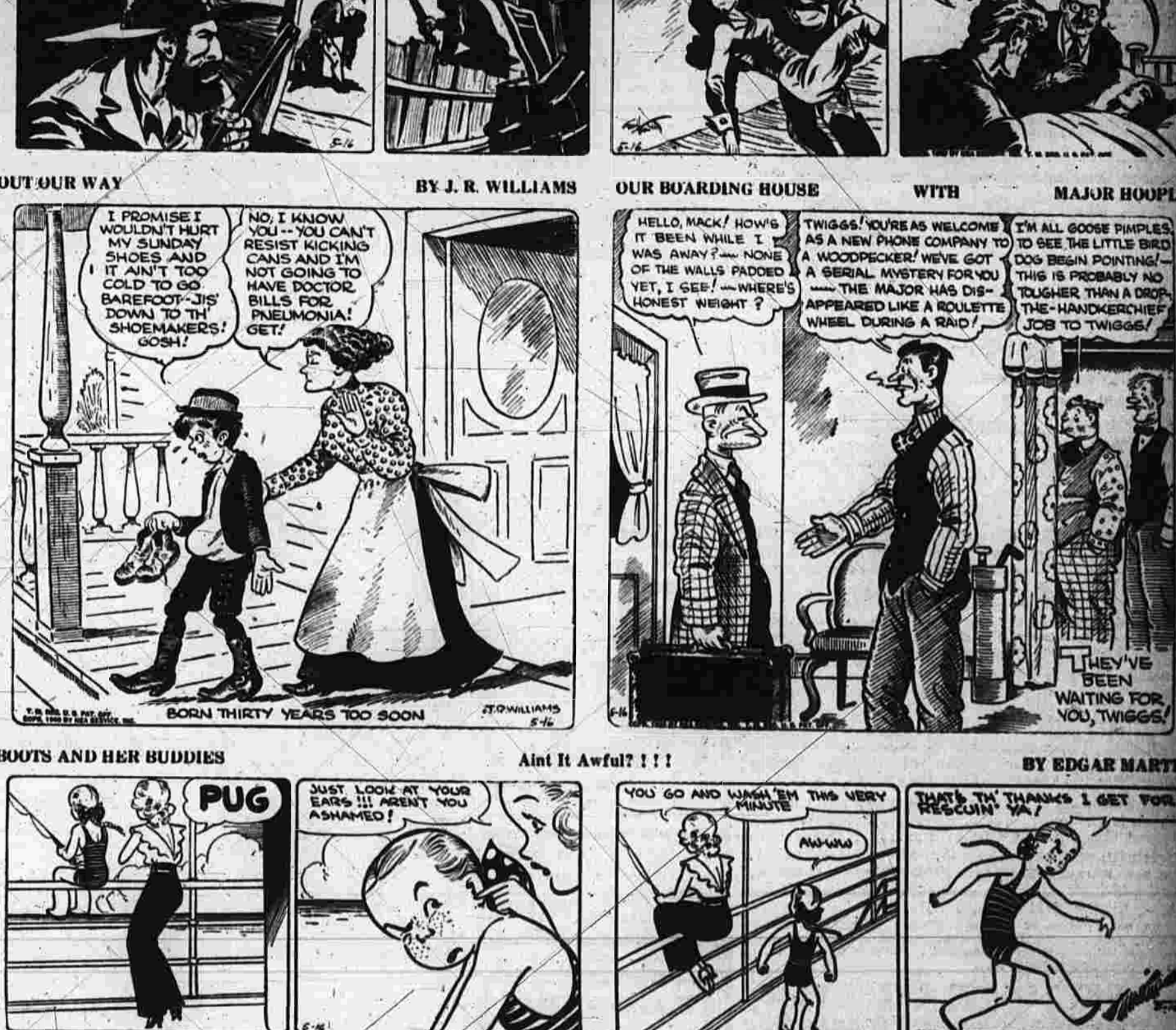
