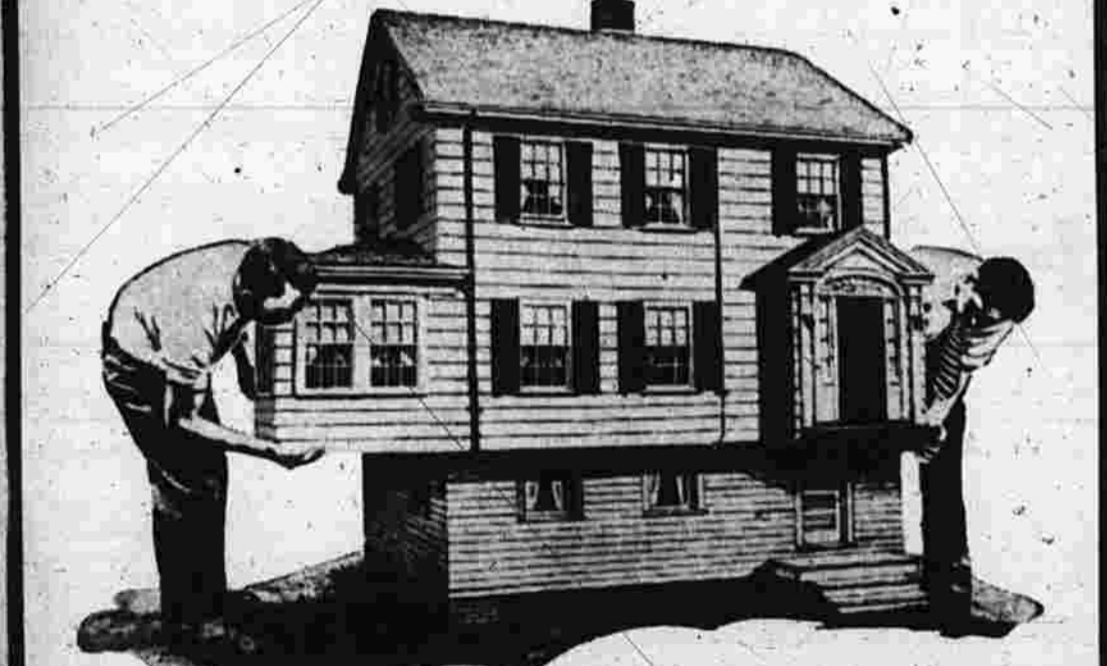



New Organ Dedicated At the Center Church

Musical Program of High Standard Offered—A Review of Selections Given.

An appreciative audience was present last night at the Center church for the dedication of the new organ installed at the Center church, the generous gift of Clifford R. Burr and Herbert B. Howe.

The program was of high standard and proved a musical treat. The audience was privileged to hear artistic reach a peak in quiet rendition not often heard here.

Walter Davley who officiated at the organ has a high rating in his profession and his fine selection exemplified the full possibilities of the organ.

Opening Numbers

A group of three numbers played by him as the opening offering in the program were "Chorale" by Mendelssohn, "Ave Maria" (Bach in D) by Bach, and "Toccata (10th Symphony) by Wagner." The chorale was a well chosen opening and devotional atmosphere pervaded the entire service.

The "Widow" "Toccata" is a number calling for the skill of a master musician coupled with organ equipment requisite for a complete offering as written. These numbers were played with a firmness at the climax and was one of the numbers that set out possibilities of the instrument.

Second Group

The next group was to a contrasting vein and the numbers were "Ave Maria" by Schubert, "Lullaby" by Schumann, "Toccata" by Liszt, and "The Last Chord" by Liszt.

The first of these was a beautiful and delicate tonal quality more extensively portrayed. The "Lullaby" was a well chosen movement where he carried the melody as a chime solo and the delicate playing on the organ was always popular number. A pleasing interpretation of the organist showed its appreciation of this number. "The Last Chord" was well known and the organist brought out again the organ's possibilities.

The Final Group

Mr. Davley in his final group chose "Air" from "The Water Music" by Bach, "Toccata" by Arandine, and "Toccata" (in D Minor) by Bach, and in these Mr. Davley set himself to show the possibilities of the organ.

The Handel always popular, was played in a setting with the clarity carrying the theme supported in an obligato by the organ, and the effective use of these very pleasing organ soloed to its melodious rendition. The "Ave Maria" portrayed all the atmosphere of devotion and appeal in this sacred theme. Here again Mr. Davley used the chime and the contrast in expression were pleasing.

Final Offering

The concluding offering was the "Ave Maria" by Schubert. This composition was brought out, and in the intricate pedal movements the response from the element of the organ was outstanding in general. The organ demonstrated last night came as a pleasing surprise. The organist after the music on his excellent work throughout the evening. Mr. Davley's selections.

Robert Dollner, violinist, played solo numbers in two group offerings, in which he was accompanied at the piano by Burdette Hawley.

Mr. Dollner's first group selections were "Ave Maria" (from "The Water Music" by Bach), "The Andante" is an always pleasing number to hear, but when played by an artist it seems to have fresh beauties. 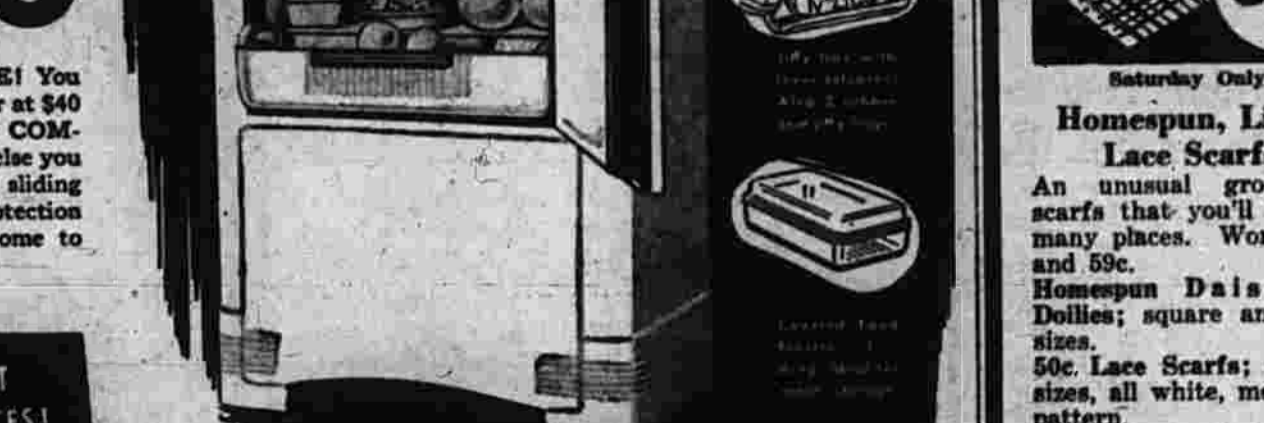

He added that while some phases of the president's program might take many months to get under way, Mr. Roosevelt had suggested a number of activities which could be translated into immediate work.
