THE state capitol at Boise, Id., forms the central design of the U. S. 3-cent commemorative honoring the 50th anniversary of Idaho's admission to statehood. The stamp will be placed on first-day sale at Boise July 2.

Canada may honor expeditionary forces with a postage item for early release. Canada did not issue a C. E. F. stamp during the World War.

Issuance of a U. S. stamp honoring nurses has been suggested for release on May 12, 1941, the anniversary of Florence Nightingale's birth, now celebrated annually in United States as National Hospital Day.

France has released three semi-postals honoring World War heroes Joffre, Foch and Gallieni. A fourth semi-postal symbolizes women taking over men's jobs during war.

Great Britain's six values, commemorating the centennial of the postage stamp, show medallion portraits of Queen Victoria and King George VI.

Approximately 99,000 varieties of postage stamps have been released in the 100 years since the first Penny Black was printed. United States has issued about 4300 stamps.
