Washington, May 23.—(AP)—President Roosevelt, it was learned today, has decided to revive the "Council of National Defense"—in the World War a board of six cabinet officers and seven civilian experts.

of the bridges from the Dutch. He attacked the Who's Who against all attacks for three days and nights until land troops reached the river.

"We flew over high," said one who had received the iron cross for his exploit. "We jumped from a low altitude so we were not in the air so long—probably about 300 meters. There was a bad wind and some of the boys landed in the river."

The troops, a short, freckled lad, was from a Hanover, said they immediately dug into shallow holes around the bridge and retained all efforts to dislodge them. Their object was to prevent the Dutch from blowing up two bridges each about a mile long—one a railway bridge and the other on a highway.

"I was a private," said one of the boys who had been in the front line. "I was a private in the 102nd Infantry, collecting names of all veteran organizations in order to send them invitations for the dedication of the new veterans' home at Rocky Hill.
