Texas Democrats Voting To Decide Garner Pledge

By The Associated Press. Texas Democrats were deciding today whether to pledge their 46 national convention delegates to Vice President Garner, who unsuccessfully contested backwoods President Roosevelt in four state primaries. In Garner's home state the question came before a convention of 2,000 men and women. Leaders of "Garner" forces predicted Garner's endorsement for the presidential nomination along with a resolution approving the Roosevelt-Garner administration. On the other hand a third group talked of a possible "stampede" to the president. Has More Than Majority. Whatever the Texas convention outcome, Mr. Roosevelt already has received the pledges of more than a majority of the delegates to the Democratic national convention in Chicago July 15. New Mexico Democrats in state convention yesterday instructed their six delegates to vote for the president's renomination if he wishes.

Surrender Seen 'Reasonable Act'

Berlin, May 28.—(AP)—Informed German circles said today that the capitulation of King Leopold's Army was "one of the most reasonable acts" the young monarch ever committed. The Belgian king's order to his army to surrender surprised in these German quarters, where it was said the first word of the event came through the broadest channels of the press. It was indicated, however, that German military authorities not in touch with intermediaries of King Leopold late last night.

Nazis Intensify Narvik Aid Effort

Stockholm, May 28.—(AP)—The German Army in Norway is being intensified efforts today to get aid in the beleaguered port of Narvik, Arctic iron ore port. Reports reaching here were that 1,200 German Alpine fighters had been landed at Narvik in the past two days. Twelve large transport planes, each carrying about 50 men, were reported to be making two trips daily to the Narvik region. The effects of the war extended steadily northward, the newspaper Social Democrat reported that Tromsø was being cleared of its population as a precaution against air raid attacks.

His headline over a caustic editorial was "Crisis over the King." The newspaper added that "we always knew the brunt of our effort would fall on the British empire and the French republic. Now the traitor is branded inescapably on our brains."

Principal Speaker. Aircraft Corporation to Double Size of Its Plant in East Hartford; 4,000 More Jobs. Possibility that Manchester's population may jump by more than 5,000 within the coming year—maybe much more—was indicated today as the United Aircraft Corporation announced plans to start immediate construction of a plant which will approximately double the size of the engine production division. Over \$5,000,000 has been allotted for expansion at the East Hartford factories during the year, providing jobs for about 4,000 more employees. Canada Planning To Expand Army

New York, May 28.—(AP)—Formal plans for the first of a series of national preparedness drills should be entered into a single-headed preparedness program, Hoover said today.

The head of such an administrative program, Hoover said, should be a non-partisan advisory board and sub-directors for agriculture, labor and industry, the former president declared.

"The whole of the purchasing and manufacturing for the Army and Navy from private industry should be done by this administrative board," Hoover said.

"This form of organization can and should be based on organized cooperation," Hoover said.

Hoover said his conception of preparedness was a strong Navy, a skeletonized but more flexible Army, additions of skilled personnel to the reserves, air-pilots, tank drivers and gunners.

He expressed belief it was not the president's proposal to produce a "single" program to be put away in a closet.

In the face of constantly advancing science and invention, it would be folly to have 50,000 planes, 50,000 tanks, 50,000 ships, require more than a half million men to look after them and to support them in the years of existence, a billion dollars a year to buy them.

Asserting that Americans have no good reason to be discouraged by the increased cost of living, Hoover said: "Once we convince the world that our capabilities are organized, no action will have any desire to establish bases on the western hemisphere or make any attack upon us now or any other time."

4,304 Workers Placed in Jobs

Washington, May 28.—(AP)—Jobs in private industry were found for 4,304 workers in the state during the month of April, state Labor Commissioner Cornelius J. Danaher announced today.

The placements represent an increase of 1,850 over the month of March, Danaher said.

New registrations totaled 5,333 in April, an increase of 22 per cent from the 5,216 in March. Renewals, also, were greater, in April, climbing from 14,568 to 16,514, up 11 per cent over March.

Consequently, the total active file of the office showed an increase of 800 and supplementary placements in which the employer specified by name the individuals to be hired, totaled 153. The grand total of 5,317 is an increase of 38 per cent over the 3,884 placements made in March and an increase of 19 per cent over the 4,476 in April.

Manchester Memorial Hospital, typical of community hospitals throughout the eastern United States, is not the entire nation, constantly and with purpose, created at a loss, financially, it was explained today in an interview with Dr. Harry C. Smith, the hospital's superintendent.

In 1939 the hospital spent \$116,802. It received from the state \$96,228. The operating deficit was more than \$20,500.

"But this is as it should be," Dr. Smith said today. "We are in business to serve the sick and we are not to make money."

Dr. Smith said that the board of trustees own and operate the hospital for profit. The hospital is not a charity, he said.

"Trustees contribute \$5 annually automatically becomes an incorporator," Dr. Smith said, "and is eligible to vote at the annual meeting. Trustees are not to be elected by the community, but by the hospital board of trustees."
