As a result of his discovery, the British admiralty prescribed that crews in British men of war should be given lime juice or lemon juice to ward off scurvy, and English sailors became known around the world as "limies." The pity is that the prescription was not universal, for almost to the end of the days of sailing ships the lack of Vitamin C in the fare of sailors made the men subject to that painful and sometimes fatal disease.




