



Tells of Associates

Bishop Bartiett in his introductory remarks spoke of his association with many of the older residents of Manchester and especially those long term members of St. Mary's parish. He revealed the manner in which he, while yet a student at Trinity, was encouraged by Dr. Bidwell of the faculty to enter the ministry. He lauded the great efforts of the early church leaders in establishing the faith in the state and in Manchester. He also mentioned the fact that several Bishops of the church had served in the parish.

Bishop Bartlett declared emphatically that the church cannot be destroyed. 'The church will survive Hitler, the English Empire and the American Democracy,' he said. "The church is built on the common faith of the people. It has been in poor and meager straits during its history and sometimes the leadership of the church provides for the individual from childhood to old age, in days of adversity and of abject need.

New York, June 11—(P)—A momentous Monday gave American listeners another chance to tune in on history as it was made both in Europe and at home.

First came Premier Mussolini's long-awaited war declaration that put Italy on the side of Hitler's Germany, announced in a speech lasting a little more than 15 minutes.

Not long afterward Premier Reynaud came on from Paris to declare in a four-minute reply to II Duce that Franca cannot be conquered. He was followed in an hour or so by Lord Duff Cooper, British Minister of Information.

Finally, in early evening there was the climax in President Roosevelt's important address at the University of Virginia, sent over all networks and all available short wave stations, with translations added.

Signals from overseas were unusually strong, the microphone relaying loudly the shouts of the crowds which at times almost drowned out Mussolini's words.







