Niagara is 167 feet high, is approximately a mile wide. The water is free from sediment and its clearness adds to the beauty of the cataract. The scenic value depends upon the volume of wa-ter flowing over the falls and upon its distribution in American and Horseshoe Falls. nd Horseshoe Falls.

The brink of the falls is reced ing at an average rate of 21/2 feet a year, but scenic beauty of Nizgara is to be preserved by cooperation of Canada and United
States in checking erosion, insuring even distribution of water.
