





2,190,000 New Taxpayers.

The tax bill, approved after three days of Senate debate, would create 2,190,000 new taxpayers by reducing present income exemptions from \$2,500 to \$2,900 for married persons and from \$1,000 to \$800 for single persons.

It would add 1 per cent to existing corporation taxes, increase all individual income tax payments by a flat 10 per cent, boost surtaxes on incomes between \$6,000 and \$100,000, and increase such so-called "nuisance taxes" as those on gasoline, I iquor, beer, amustments, radios and mechanical refrigerators.

The Federal debt limit would be raised from \$45,000,000,000 to \$49,000,000,000 and a special \$4,000,000,000 issue of defense bonds would be paid off with revenue from the new taxes over a five-

Eliminates Tobacco Taxes
The Senate eliminated a House-proved increase in tobacco taxes, including a penny-a-package boost on cigarettes. To make up for this \$76,000,000 loss of revenue, it inserted a new schedule of amusement taxes imposing a 10 per cent levy on all admissions costing 10 cents or more. The House bill would have started the tax at 30 cents. Under present law, the tax begins at 40 cents.

The LaFoliette excess profits amendment would allow corporations a \$30,000 exemption plus an amount equal to 8 per cent of their invested capital. Other Federal taxes would be deducted before computing profits.

A corporation would pay 20 per cent on profits in excess of the exemptions, up to a 20 per cent return on invested capital. On profits exceeding a 20 per cent return on investment, it would pay 40 per cent.

How Tax Would Be Computed Thus, a corporation with \$100.000 invested capital and net profits of \$25,000 would compute its tax as follows:
