arrived for Britain from Australia and New Zealand. Thousands of fighting planes landed from world-wide bases at a British port, abouting for a "chance at Jerry."

The casualties of the second big air raid were announced after the report by the Air Ministry and the Ministry of Home Security. The reports also mentioned damage in three towns.

This attack, apparently Germany's most determined aerial effort against Great Britain, followed by just one day and night, although it was extensive, took a toll of 12 British civilians.

The raids produced a realistic picture to the public of the situation in the air. The Minister of Home Security, Winston Churchill and War Minister Anthony Eden were expected to comment on the situation.

British newspapers published without comment dispatches from Washington announcing the United States had sent notes to Italy and Germany warning that they would not stand for their annexation of any British or French territory in the western hemisphere.

To Connect New Tract To Town Sewer Lines

Acceptable Plan Is Arrived at Town Council Says Developers Prefer Connection.

Judge William S. Hyde, Manchester town councilman, stated today that he expects a wholly amicable settlement of the question of sewerage of the Manchester corporation, a section located in the Otis-Center streets area. Recently much official local commotion has been occasioned by a report that the development was to be served by septic tank installations.

It appears that the Manchester corporation desires sewer service for its new home, with nearly seventy provided for in the layout of the tract.

Thought impossible to obtain today when the development was originally planned, with septic tanks was deemed inadvisable because of the cost of running a main line to any point where they might be installed. The development was perfectly willing to accept the alternative of a nearby trunk line with which they would be connected by a main line of 12 inches in diameter.

Without such a right of way, running up a grade by a very long main line installation would have been necessary. Hence, the developers took what was considered the only solution, that would entail great cost, out of proportion to the need, and fell back on the alternative of septic tanks, a means which was approved by the state board of health.

It was stressed today, however, that this plan was intended only after it appeared that sewerage could not be had at a reasonable cost. Since publication of plans, however, officials have become interested, as they appear to feel that large new developments should be served by new lines to be added to the town sewerage system.

Investigation has shown that the tract could be connected to a main line by running a main line of 12 inches in diameter, extending about 800 feet across private property on Otis-Center street, with the main line crossing with the owner of this property to a main line on Otis-Center street.

It is this main line to be installed by the Manchester corporation, and then may be used to dispose of the sewage. Then the town will secure the right of way needed to lay the main line.

A right of way is a necessity at this point since the Manchester fire department will be held to the town owned system, does not follow highway but here crosses lands at the rear of lands owned by the Manchester corporation.

Judge Hyde said this morning that he expects that all of the parties concerned will cooperate in securing this utilities improvement.

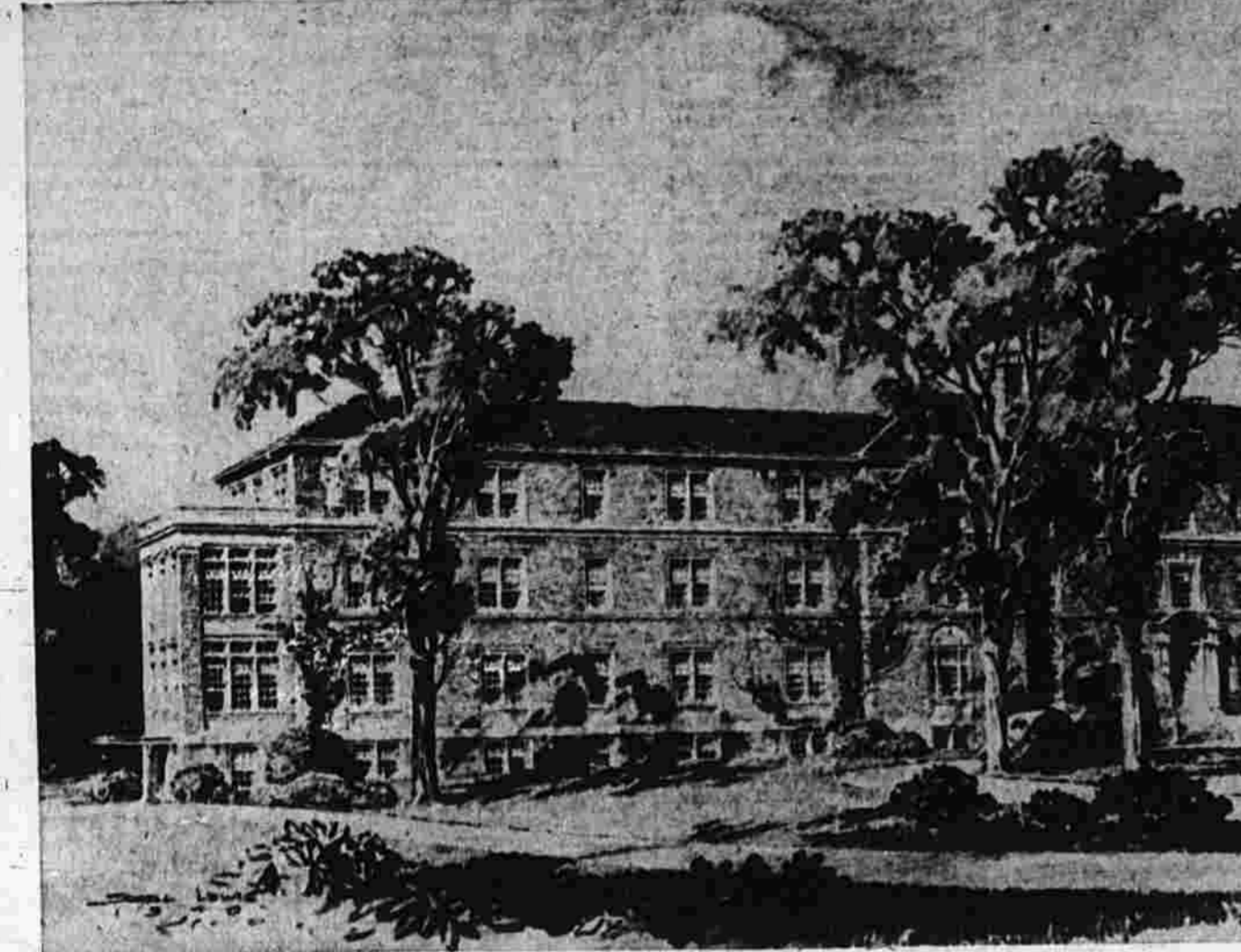
