> STAMP NEWS THE pharmacists of the United

States are after a stamp, at least a campaign is under way to place a symbol of pharmacy on a U. S. stamp. More than 60,000 druggists have signed petitions for the stamp and a national committee intends to boost the number to 500,000.

With the war wiping European countries off the map one after another, stamp dealers report a new surge of interest in American values, particularly such old and rare issues as the Confederate states.

The first airmail samps appeared less than 24 years ago, are today steadily rising in value. A complete collection in 1930 was valued at about \$6000, today one is worth about \$20,000. San-

Two more Mexican commemorative sets are in preparation. One. consisting of two stamps, is to mark the 400th anniversary of the founding of Campeche, settled by the Spaniards in 1540. Founding of the "first university in America" will be marked by a set of six. three regular postage, three air-mail. Far Vasco de Quiroga is said to have organized the institution at Patriagra at Patzcuaro.

More than 400 major and minor varieties of "war" stamps have appeared since World War No. 2 started last September. These stamps are either revisions in values or overprints due to the war. Few are new issues.
