He Took to Water Like a Duck And There He Found His Hobby

Les Buckland, a Champion Swimmer, Grows Water Lilies in Many Varied Hues; His Gardens Are a Beautiful Sight.



By Lillian Pond There is little wonder that more and more people plan each year at this time to visit Les Buckland's lovely water lily gardens on Hillside Road. Only those of us who have visited these fast becoming famous gardens fully appreciate what we have practically at our doorstep one of the most beautiful collections of hardy water lilies in this section of the country.

However, comparatively few of us know that we have a young man in our midst who has been devoting almost all of his leisure hours for the past two years to the development and culture of these aquatic plants. Our knowledge of this hobby is so limited that we are not even aware of the fact that Les Buckland has a water lily pond in full bloom at 1 o'clock in the morning.

My reportorial visit, I noted Mr. Buckland in his favorite element—working among his thousands of beautiful water lilies. A little bit about what went into this glorious collection of beautiful water lilies is the story I bring.

First, he wanted me to understand that he considers himself nothing more than an enthusiastic amateur hobbyist who has had a great deal of fun in the pursuit of his hobby. We recall correctly that this young man has been water lily growing since he was a boy.

His first stop was in Ohio, where he visited a number of commercial growers. At St. Louis he had the thrilling experience of spending an entire afternoon with the world's greatest living hybridizer, George Prince, superintendent of the Missouri Botanical Garden.

But the West still called, so he pushed on to Los Angeles to see Harry Johnson, the best and possibly the best informed water lily grower on the West Coast. Mr. Johnson took an immediate liking to Mr. Buckland (which I'd like to think was mutual).

Britain's Marooned Sea Queen May Sail

The Queen Elizabeth is a 83,000-ton liner, built for the Cunard line, and was the largest ship in the world when she was launched in 1929.

She was captured by German submarines in the North Atlantic in December 1940, and was held in a port in the West Indies for several months.

It is now reported that the ship will be sailed to the United States, where she will be used as a troop transport.
