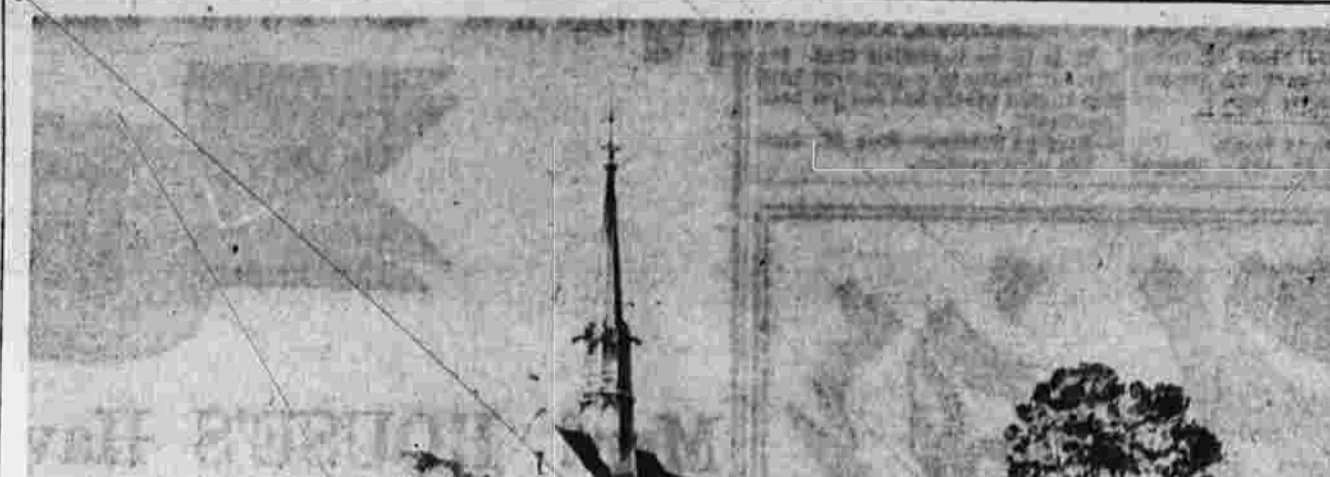


Plan Building Changes For St. Mary's Church
