### Small Force Is Basis For Planes Program

#### Fewer Than 450 Combat Ships to Defend Continental Area of United States Available.

Washington, July 2.—(AP)—The world's leading air power is reported to be producing 30,000 airplanes a year. What is the status of the United States' air defense?

How many are producing? How many can we produce? How many can we buy for immediate use? The Special News Service of the Associated Press has sent its aviation editor on a tour of the leading airplane manufacturing plants. His stories, each self-contained, will analyze the nation's air defense in building our air defense. The first follows.

Seattle, Wash., July 2.—If this country were to be drawn into war tomorrow, the Army Air Corps would have fewer than 450 combat planes for the defense of the United States.

It would have less than 1,500 for the defense of the western hemisphere and the Pacific.

Last year American aircraft factories turned out less than 2,000 military planes, including such combat types as trainers and personnel transports. The world's leading air power, Germany, is reported to have a current production of from 30,000 to 40,000 planes a year.

The state of America's air defense establishment and its low factory production, are the chief reasons why we could not respond to French Premier Raymond seventh-hour plea for "clouds of planes."

80 Per Cent Unfit.

We go here several thousand military airplanes in the United States, but 80 per cent would be useless in wartime. Many trainers are obsolete.

During the war games on the Texas-Louisiana border last month, the Army Air Corps was directed for a concentration of all its fighter squadrons at the Barksdale Field camp, organized in 24 hours.

The GHQ Air Force, organized in 1935, is charged with the air defense of continental United States.

A total of 22 planes showed up, including 2 of our 30,000 combat long-range Boeing heavy bombers, manufactured here in Seattle. The rest were in the shop for overhaul. In all, the GHQ has less than 450 combat planes.

Navy's Air Arm Separate

The Navy's air arm must be considered separately because its operations are associated intimately with the movements of the fleet. The GHQ, which type for type has much faster planes than the Navy, enjoys also a greater latitude of activity. The Army Air Corps carries out our "vital line" of air defense.

The Navy's air power, too, has been at low ebb.

Senator Byrd, of Virginia, said on May 24 that on the basis of figures submitted to the Senate Naval Committee by Rear Admiral John H. Towers, chief of Naval aviation, only 500 aircraft, capable of meeting modern European warplanes, equal combat were attached to the fleet.

Whether the state of our air defense is critical or not depends on (1) the importance the United States attaches to air power in relation to sea power; (2) the strength of its ground Army, (3) the extent to which it can be stepped up; (4) the rate at which airplanes can be produced; (5) the continued availability of many raw materials.

Continued production is estimated by John H. Doust, president of the Aeronautical Chamber of Commerce, trade as-

sembly, at 3,000 machines a month. Louis Johnson, assistant secretary of war, at 4,000 a month with a prospect of 6,000 a month by mid-September.

American Production Estimates

Joseph A. McCarty, an American production expert, estimates that 20,000 planes in an annual basis. Johnson says the aircraft industry is geared now to turn out 16,000 a year, and will be stepped up without emergency means to 20,000 by January.

Meanwhile the major aircraft engine factories are not expected to reach a production of 20,000 units of 1,000 horsepower each until next March, and the armed services—with an admitted paucity of pilots—are girding themselves to turn out 16,000-odd fighters a year. Barring breakers or loss in combat, one sturdy warplane is estimated to require 16 months of a day.

Henry Ford has said that within six months he can produce 10,000 planes a day if the government program to increase production begins. In the history of government procurement in peacetime, no warplane ever have been manufactured without changes in design during production.

### Opposition Seen to Excess Profits Tax on Individuals

Washington, July 2.—(AP)—Considerable opposition to an excess profits tax on individuals, as recommended by President Roosevelt, was predicted today, by Senator George (D., Ga.), who said that a similar levy on corporations probably would be enacted.

Mr. Roosevelt asked yesterday for a steeply graduated excess profits tax to be applied to all individuals and all corporate organizations without discrimination.

It is our duty to see that the burden is equitably distributed according to ability to pay so that a few do not gain from the sacrifice of the many," he said.

Group "Guarantees Team-work"

House "Republican" members already had ordered an excess profits tax study, said the president's 89-word message, "guaranteeing teamwork" between the White House and Congress on the proposition.

Mr. Roosevelt did not propose a formula, but Representative Harry Bourn of Texas, House Democratic leader, said after a preliminary conference that the proposed legislation would be along lines of the World War taxes.

The old excess profits tax, levied on 1918 earnings, took 9 per cent of an individual's earnings above \$5,000 and therefore was paid by many professions, men and higher salaried workers. It was in addition to income taxes.

law, factory inspectors do not now secure the complete data on hours worked and wages and overtime paid required by the Fair Labor Standards Act. In the future, they will obtain all this data under the authority of the Wage and Hour Division.

In all investigations the state inspectors will follow the procedure set forth in the Department's Manual of the Wage and Hour Division. In this manner their reports will be as full and complete as those of the inspectors employed by the Wage and Hour Division. In similar manner they will also follow procedure set forth under regulations of the U. S. Department of Labor on all cases involving violation of the child labor provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act.

Report Violations

Inspector of the Department of Labor, charged with the enforcement of the State minimum wage laws will report violations of both the Wage/Hour Law and the child labor provisions of the Act to the Fair Labor Standards Division of the Department. This will include violations in industries, non-work.

Under the existing Connecticut law, the State Department of Labor is authorized to bring suit against employers who violate the Act.

Under the Federal Wage/Hour Law, the Wage and Hour Division is not charged with the duty but the Act specifically provides (Section 16 (b)) the manner in which employers may bring suit for wages and overtime due. Unless the agreement signed by Governor Baldwin, the State Department may bring suit in behalf of employees under Section 16(b) of the Act. All cases requiring litigation against employers will be referred to the Regional Director of the Wage and Hour Division, New York and Connecticut.

As heretofore, all cases involving criminal violations of the act will continue to be referred to the U. S. Department of Justice. Wage and hour Division attorneys will continue to prosecute civil actions.

In announcing that he had signed the agreement with Governor Baldwin, Mr. Fleming said:

"This agreement makes a definite forward step in the enforcement of the Federal Wage-Hour Law. It is a distinct advantage to the Division to have available services of the factory inspectors of the State Department of Labor. For the employer it also has distinct advantages. It saves him from the annoyance of having the State inspector and a Federal inspector make a series of calls and in some cases requiring him to keep different sets of records. At the same time, it will greatly facilitate the work of both the State and Federal inspection forces. Congress had this in mind when it provided for the delegation to State agencies, which met the requirements of the Wage and Hour Division of power to enforce the functions of the Division."

"Our experience in North Carolina justifies the belief that extension of this State agency program, enforcement of the Fair Labor Standards Act will be greatly facilitated."
