# 150 to 100 Die During Mexico Election Riots

**Two days of rioting in the thousands during the crackle of gunfire could be heard in Mexico City. In the early evening a driving rain sent the clouds scurrying for shelter and brought an end to the mass disorders.**

President Lazaro Cardenas himself was unable to reach the city for a half hour before a close polling places and finally departed before it could be opened on his own.

Although his party backed Cardenas, Cardenas insisted he had sent "hands off" in the campaign to name the man who succeeds him, and for a six-year term. Members of the new Congress also were elected yesterday.

During the afternoon the president made a tour of polling places in the capital and was greeted in many places by cries of "Viva Almazan!" At one point he was surrounded by a mob of "Viva Almazan!" supporters.

At Copacacan, where a large group of rioters tried to poll the place by 100 "Camachians" (followers of the late Camacho) established a separate poll.
