Britain Raided From Coast to Coast; Italians Assert Cruiser Hood Bombed

White House Gets 4 Billion Measure To Build Up Navy

Legislators Manifest Desire to Approve Request for Cash and Authorizations to Begin Expansion and Increase Army's Forces.

Washington, July 11.—(AP)—A \$4,000,000,000 Naval expansion bill was sent to the White House today by Congress. It was a major portion of the defense campaign and legislators on Capitol Hill were manifesting a desire to approve President Roosevelt's request for \$4,848,171,957 in cash and authorizations to start this expansion and to increase greatly the Army's land and air forces.

The Defense Commission announced meanwhile that it had let \$100,000,000 in contracts in recent days for new warplanes for the Army and Navy. Other contracts are being negotiated, it was said, with a view to adding 25,000 planes by the end of 1942.

World Double Size of Navy

The Navy expansion features, said to the White House President Roosevelt's signature by unanimous House agreement, will double the size of the present Navy now built.

There have been unofficial estimates that the completion of the \$4,000,000,000 program, together with other new bills, would double the size of the Navy.

It was also reported that the House would pass a bill to increase the size of the Army to 2,000,000 men, and to increase the size of the Air Force to 1,000,000 men.

British and Italian Fleets in Mediterranean Fight

Further Details Fitted Into Rome's Account Of Battle of Mediterranean; World's Largest Warship Reported Set Afire While Two Heavy Bombs Fall on Deck Of Aircraft Carrier.

Rome, July 11.—(AP)—Bomb hits on two of the mightiest units of the British fleet—the battle cruiser Hood and the aircraft carrier Ark Royal—were announced today by the Italian high command, fitting further details into the Italian account of Monday's and Tuesday's Battle of the Mediterranean. The 42,100-ton Hood, the world's largest warship, was said to be returning from yesterday's action on Tuesday's clash of warships.

The attack was delivered Tuesday, south of the Balearic Islands, on a British squadron which had come out from Gibraltar apparently seeking a western Mediterranean fight in conjunction with the British and Italian Navy's operations in the Ionian Sea.

The Italian command yesterday denied the announcement of the British attack on the Hood and the Ark Royal. The British Admiralty issued a formal denial of the Italian claim.

The attack was delivered Tuesday, south of the Balearic Islands, on a British squadron which had come out from Gibraltar apparently seeking a western Mediterranean fight in conjunction with the British and Italian Navy's operations in the Ionian Sea.

London, July 11.—(AP)—Germany's bombers, in unrelenting raids, blasted England today and turned machine-guns on civilians in the streets of towns, but England's defenses took a steady toll. The government reported that at least eight German raiders were reported shot down—three in the southwest, five from one south coast port—by British fighters and coordinated anti-aircraft fire which kept the attackers high in the sky.

Warplanes, striking against Italy, were reported by the British Ministry of Home Security to have destroyed a depot or store ship in Sicilian harbor.

Two Bombers Killed

In a southeastern town a German raid killed two persons. British fighter planes chased the plane out to sea and were believed to have shot it down.

The British Ministry of Home Security issued a communique saying: "During the night bombs were dropped on a number of scattered points in the eastern and southern coasts and in the Midlands. No casualties were reported except a small number in two towns."

Enemy planes were reported to have been shot down in the southwest and in the southeastern town where two deaths were reported.

Bombs Found Close to Site Of Convention

Two Powerful Dynamic Missiles Discovered Near Hall During Republican Party Session

Philadelphia, July 11.—(AP)—Philadelphia officials contradicted today New York police assertions that bombs had been found near the Republican National Convention hall here, while an aide of Gov. Arthur H. James of Pennsylvania said today that no bombs were discovered near the convention.

The New York police said that they had found two powerful dynamic bombs near the convention hall during the Republican National Convention in Philadelphia two weeks ago. It was learned from a high police authority today after the New York police had reported that the bombs were found near the convention hall.

It was also reported that Hungary would accept German mediation for a plan whereby Russia would be asked to return the newly-ceded territory to Rumania.

The German sources said that the Hungarian leader, Premier Count Pal Teleky and Foreign Minister Count Istvan Csank, gave assurances in their Munich conference with the German and Italian leaders that they would wait patiently for revision of Balkan territories until scores first had been settled with England.

Return to Budapest

The German reaction came as Teleky and Csank returned to Budapest, where they faced the job of preparing the Hungarian people to renounce their hopes for immediate return of Transylvania, the Rumanian province.

Hot Weather Changes Blood

How Heat Stroke May Be Avoided Shown in Experiments.

Chicago, July 11.—The internal changes which cause the all-in feeling on a hot day, the heat stroke may be avoided and how it may be avoided are shown in experiments at the University of Illinois Medical College here.

The experiments were made under the direction of Dr. Robert W. Keeton, head of the Department of Medicine, in association with Dr. Ford K. Hick and Nathaniel Glickman.

Blood Volume Increases

It was found that in unbearable, hot, moist weather the volume of circulating blood increases. One individual's blood volume rose 100 cc. in 10 minutes.

At the same time blood coagulation increased, sometimes by as much as 50 per cent. Finally the blood temperature rose and the heart pumped faster.

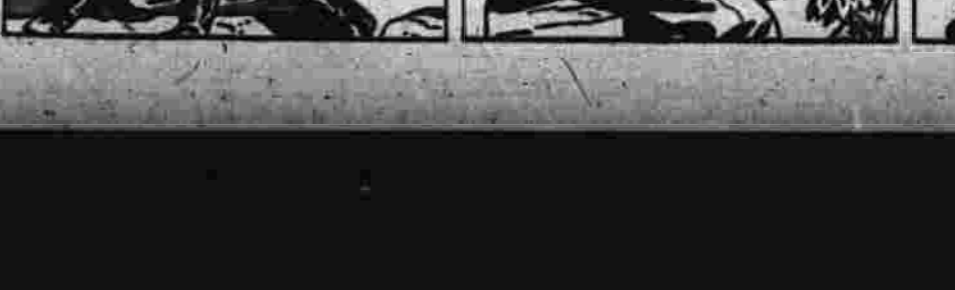
