Democratic Convention

The question of whether the Democratic Convention, opening today at Chicago, should nominate President Roosevelt by acclamation or go through the usual routine of a roll-call of the states and the presentation of names of such candidates as may care to cast themselves in front of the New Deal steampower, appears to be the major one at issue. The fact that Mr. Roosevelt has never yet spoken as to his own attitude toward a third term, and that his name has been mentioned so far, has at least added to the uncertainty. There is only one possible conclusion. He will be nominated and he will accept. The matter of the nomination, if he wanted it, has been beyond doubt all along. And a theatrical declination of the nomination, after it had been tendered to him, would be to throw the convention and the party into such a state of confusion that a Democratic defeat at the polls in November, particularly with such a very strong candidate as Willie carrying the Republican banner, would be a foregone conclusion.

The apparently very real fight being made by Postmaster-general Farley against the nomination by acclamation, and his persistence in having his own name placed in nomination, is being explained variously. It is said in some quarters that Mr. Farley, as a practical politician, is even now definitely opposed to a short convention because Chicago contributed \$125,000 to get the convention and he wants to have the contributing hotel proprietors, politicians and others given a change to get back some of their money. But unless Farley knows that Ross Kelly would be puffed enough over a short convention to lose some of his Roosevelt votes, this doesn't seem like a very substantial reason.

Mr. Farley's opposition to a map convention and an acclamation nomination is probably based on broader and more important grounds. It may be taken either for granted that he is not actually trying to get the nomination for himself or even trying to block the third term movement. Farley's head has to be turned to his usual routine, and give any aspirant who can muster some votes opportunity to have his name presented, would embarrass the steamroller even though thin. He isn't anxious to have the Republicans tell the people that Mr. Roosevelt nominated himself and that nobody else was allowed a look-in on the nomination.

So it is highly probable that it is anxiety to make the convention look at least a little like the Republican convention, in being a bona fide and unbiased gathering of the party to deliberate and decide on candidates and platform, which underlies the Farley move against acclamation.

Perhaps the convention will be long enough anyhow. The job of the resolutions committee, led by Senator Wheeler shouting lustily for an outright declaration against war outside the Western Hemisphere, and doubting more than a few pretty influential Democrats ready to join him in a head-on battle over this point. These people are going to see that Mr. Roosevelt's very definite promise not to send troops to Europe does not cover all the ground covered by a good definition of "Europe." Nor does "Europe" include the Far East. And if they can't get what they want in the resolutions committee, there is a chance of this issue being carried to the floor.

The Guard and the Draft

When, some days ago, this newspaper expressed the view that the National Guard, as constituted under the National Defense Act of 1920, would never be a wholly satisfactory organization until that act was revised, we were talking about the National Guard as it has gone on from year to year under a division of authority in time of profound peace and in time of actual war under such conditions of actual service as it is now proposed to impose upon at least four of its divisions and many of its anti-aircraft forces and harbor defense units.

If this very considerable force is to be used for a full year's training there is no reason to fear that it will not function with as much smoothness as if it were made up of a comparable number of units of the regular Army, or that the training will be either less efficient or less effective than in the standing Army. It is to be anticipated that there will be no nonsense or make believe about the proposed year of training that has actually been incorporated in the regular military establishment of the nation in time of war.

Apparently there is no intention of taking already existing National Guard divisions into service bodily, since it is stated that the four to be trained will be made up of the major units of the National Guard being formed from New York and New Jersey troops; the second from units of the Guards of Tennessee and South Carolina, a third from organizations in New Mexico, Arizona and Oklahoma, and the fourth from Guard elements in Oregon, Washington, Montana and Idaho. This apparently leaves out the New England divisions, though it would seem more than likely that anti-aircraft and harbor defense units now existing in these states will be included among the organizations of this character to be trained. Most people have assumed, therefore, that the Burke-Wadsworth Selective Service bill as adopted, is likely to be sent to large camps to receive their training from the ground up. There were great numbers of newly organized units of the National Guard in the World War. This does not appear to be the present plan. Instead the selected draftees are to be regarded as recruits for the regular Army and the National Guard—excepting as to duration of service—up to the outbreak of hostilities. The strength of these units, and taken in various regular and National Guard organization to receive their training there.

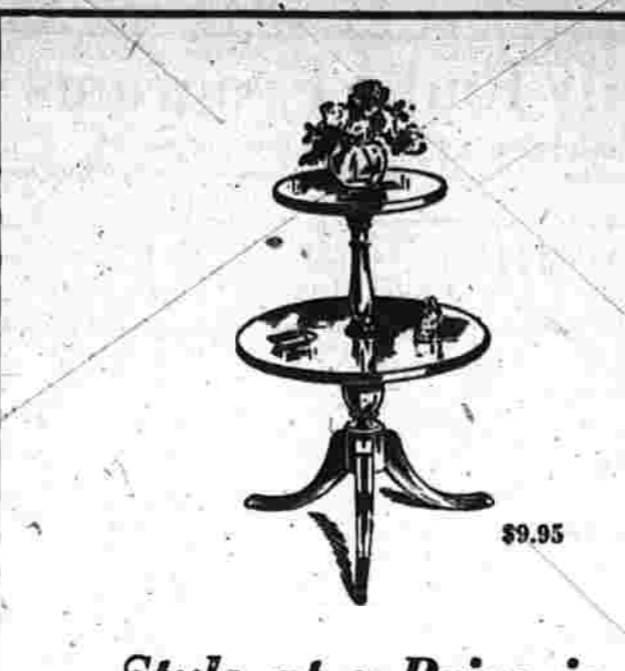

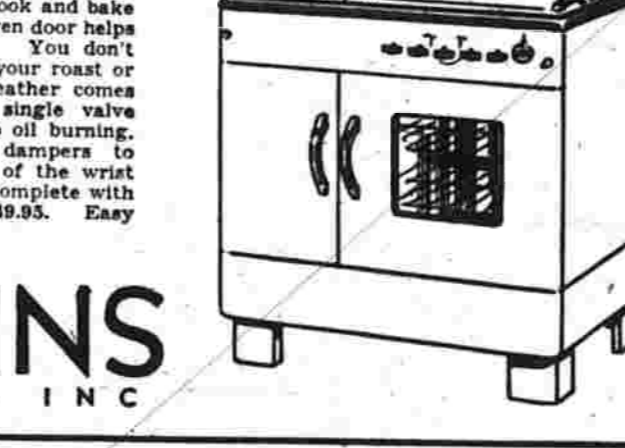

Married Men May Resign

Lowest Ranks of National Guard May Quit to Prevent Hardships. Washington, July 15.—Married men in the lowest ranks of the National Guard—private, corporal and sergeant—will be permitted to resign in an effort to prevent unnecessary hardships resulting from the new pay schedule. This was the recommendation of War Department officials, who said that private soldiers had been asked to perform duty for extended periods when they are absent from military training. These plans were adopted prior to announcement of the proposal for new training of the National Guardsmen, however, and provide for a maximum absence of 60 days. As a result, the leave arrangements may be revised.

Other developments arising on the defense program included: First 20 Billion Bonds. Representative Reed (R., N. Y.), asserted in a formal statement that the present session of Congress was the first \$20,000,000,000 session in American history, surpassing by almost \$2,000,000,000 the total appropriations by any one session during the World War.

Governmental officials were gratified by assurance from Edward G. Breitlin, Jr., member of the National Defense Commission, that the United States has developed by being made independent of foreign sources for key arms materials. He predicted that by the end of this month plans would be complete to produce with domestic resources in the future, if necessary, in quantities sufficient to free American industry entirely from dependence on the Far East.

The Civilian Control Authority reported that the number of airports, landing fields and seaplane bases in the United States had increased by 304 from Jan. 1 to July 1 of this year. They totaled 2,680 on July 1.

London became the world's largest city (pop. 8,500,000), heart of an empire embracing one-fourth the earth and its inhabitants.

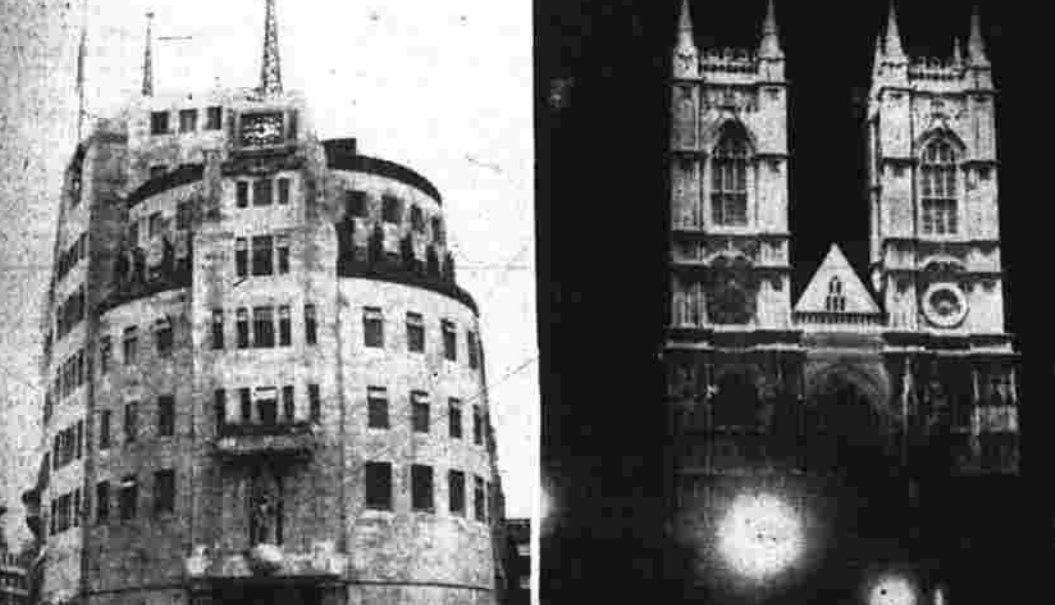
