Experts Give Advice To Poison Ivy Victims

Paying Taxes In Two Towns

Hartford, July 16.—Persons who are sensitive to poison ivy should avoid crushing it and handling articles which may have had contact with the oily sap from the plant, according to a bulletin of the State Department of Health. This vine is another "misery" plant, similar to ragweed, which poisons cause hayfever and which is now the object of active community campaigns to eradicate it from the state. The sap from poison ivy also causes much harm among susceptible people.

When one has been exposed, the bulletin advised that prompt action be taken to remove the oil from the skin. The oily sap is insoluble in water but can be dissolved and removed effectively by washing thoroughly with common laundry soap, if applied as soon as possible. A stiff brush that might break the skin should not be used in this procedure. Scratching the affected areas with the cluster of three shiny leaves.

Police Officer Griffin Now Occupies Home After Difficulties
