There are five battleships, marking the last voyage of the training ship "Presidente Sar-miento," is building five new destroyers and five patrol vessels. Two battleships, six cruisers, a

training crulser, 17 destroyers three submarines, 17 patrol vessels, two river monitors and six small transports make up Argensmall transports make up Argentina's navy.




