

DECLARATION of American policy, made by a President o United States in a message to Con-gress, and not officially endorsed by either Congress or the Ameripronouncement, today becomes bulwark of Western Hemisphere

"Monroe Doctrine" in 1823, as a warning to European powers not to interfere with the established ndependence of Spain's former The warning was sufficient for Austria, Russia, Prussia and France, and the "Monroe Doctrine," although repeatedly appealed to by successive presidents. was not formally invoked until the "Venezuela incident" of 1896, when U. S. decided Britain was encroaching upon territorial rights of Venezuela. The nation stood solidly behind Monroe's policy. 
