The Gibraltar stamp above, of the George VI coronation issue, shows the view of "The Rock" from the Spanish mainland. The tunneled, fortified mass of stone is 2% miles

long, three-fourths mile wide and 1396 feet high.

Moors, under Tariq, captured and fortified Gibraltar in 711. Spain regained possession in 1309, lost it in 1333, captured it again in 1462. In 1502, Gibraltar was formally incorporated into crown domain. In 800 years Gibraltar was besieged 11 times.


