Building Line Stalling

The third postponement by the Board of Selectmen of the matter of granting or rejecting the application of the Polish-American club for a change in the Florence street building line constitutes a commentary on the possibility of running this country in a business-like way under a governmental system designed for a village of two or three thousand people.

The club in question has a building at Florence and Clinton streets which, when it was built a good many years ago, conformed to the 25-foot building line then in force.
