Was Washington Wrong In Training His Army? THE American colonial army was little more than an untrained patriotic rabble when George Washington assumed command at Cambridge in 1775 the U.S. Lexington-Concord issue the Revolution

of 1925, commemorating the 150th anniversary of the first battle of Military critics now believe Washington was wrong in trying to make his army conform to British standards of strategy and discipline.
