



Other inventors claimed the telegraph, but a decision of the U.S. Supreme Court upheld Morse's patents. As early as 1832 Morse was experimenting with his idea. The first message was sent over a 10-mile wire at New York University in 1838; the first public message was transmitted over a wire between Baltimore and Washington in 1844.

European nations gave Morse many decorations and honors. In 1858 he received \$80,000 from nations of Europe. America erected a bronze statue in his honor Morse was originally an artis He studied painting and sculpportrait painter. He developed his telegraph while teaching in York University.
