3/4 cup cocoa
2 eggs
1 teaspoon baking powder
2 cups flour
2 cups cream





Mass Bombings Possible Despite Clouds or Fog

Dayton, O.—A device developed to make possible mass bombing raids under weather conditions which prevent planes from both anti-aircraft fire and enemy pilots was demonstrated recently before Allied military experts.

Developed by William F. Lear, 26-year-old radio engineer, it is intended to enable planes flying completely "blind" to reach targets such as military airports, manufacturing areas and railroads, and drop bombs through clouds or fog.

Lear, internationally known as an inventor, supplies radio equipment to several foreign governments and to domestic airlines.

Radio Set With Pointer Essentially, his device is a dial which shows from what direction radio signals are received, and a second indicator which is "tied" to the "North Pole."

The second indicator, fastened to a miniature "great circle" name device used in some ocean liners to keep them from rolling in rough seas—will keep pointing in the same direction regardless of any turns an airplane makes.

This is the way it works: If the pilot of a bombing plane knows his direction and distance from a target, all he needs to do is fly a given length of time at a known speed and signal his crew to release the bombs.

Navigation is still an imperfect art, however, and pilots get lost in a 100-mile flight, Lear demonstrated that the gyroscopic indicator, "tied" to the North Pole by a compass, will point in the same direction on any point of the compass.

As he took off, he turned the radio pointer on the same dial to a station in "friendly" territory. The objective was a known number of miles from the station. By maneuvering the plane, he made the gyroscopic indicator come to rest on the pointer.

"Flying blind" he arrived at his objective only 2.3 seconds behind the scheduled time.

Mummy of Ancient Pharaoh Studied

Calro.—Egyptologists recently studied the mummy of Pharaoh Amenemot, who ruled 3,600 years ago.

His tomb, only the third intact royal tomb discovered in the history of archeology in Egypt, was opened in the presence of the young and modern ruler of Egypt, King Farouk.

Hereafter the only intact tombs opened were those of Tut-Ankh-Amen and Psou Senne. The tomb of Psou Senne, Amenemot's predecessor and believed to have been one of King Solomon's father-in-law, was discovered in February.

A French expedition headed by Prof. Pierre Montet opened the Amenemot tomb at Tanis. The mummy reposed in a wooden coffin with the head covered by a golden mask.

Bi-Sexual Plant Produced At Will by New Method

Philadelphia.—A new feat in manipulating heredity which permits the production of a bisexual plant is reported to have been achieved by the American Philosophical Society.

The discovery has practical uses for improving crops and horticulture and is of great scientific interest. It was reported by Dr. H. E. Warner and Dr. Albert J. Black.

The test plant for this discovery was a species of pine (melandrium douglasii). The plant was sprayed with colchicine, the human poison remedy. The spray doubled the number of the pine's chromosomes.

Blue Laws Take Drubbing

New York.—An ancient blue law took another drubbing when Magistrate Michael A. Ford ruled that a Chinese laundry has the same right to work on Sundays as lovers have to hold hands.

Magistrate Ford, in deciding the case of Jack Wak, accused of violating the law, said that it used to be illegal to hold hands or kiss a wife on Sunday, but they're no longer considered punishable offenses.

Oxygen Gives Abatement Of Intense Heart Pains

Chicago.—Use of a newly-developed oxygen mask has resulted in the discovery that inhalation of oxygen in high concentrations produces "dramatic" abatement of intense heart pain.

Oxygen in proportions ranging from 80 to 100 per cent gave complete relief from pain in severe cases in which large doses of narcotics and sedatives—the usual treatment—failed.

Continued success with the "strong oxygen treatment" would give physicians a powerful weapon to combat two of the most painful and serious diseases—coronary thrombosis, a blocked artery, and severe angina pectoris.

Pneumonia Family Misfit; Exact Cause Is Unknown

Boston.—The latest attempt to classify a puzzling misfit in the family of pneumonia by the Harvard School of Public Health, revealed that it was a "family misfit" in the sense that it was not related to the common cold.

The disease, mild in comparison to other known forms of pneumonia, has challenged investigators in other parts of the country since it was first described in 1927.

Its exact cause is unknown, and it differs strikingly from pneumonia caused by bacteria.
