Emphasis on Deferment

The spectacular draft lottery is completed and something like sixteen million young men of America are awaiting their order numbers, which will govern the sequence in which they are liable to be examined as to their availability for military service.

Much emphasis is being laid on the numerous bases on which registrants may claim exemption or deferment. There are many reasons which the selective service authorities, in advance of the drawing of numbers, announced as sufficient for deferment.

The whole subject is being treated by many speakers, the greater part of the press and the very considerable part of the public as though anxiety for the registrants that have been accepted without murmur this duty as citizens.

But it is inevitable that in the draft for military training is being almost universally regarded by all but registrants in much the same way as though the business were the opportunity to face the portals of battle and no one answers a call to war with a grin any more.

But these men are not being called to war. They are being called to prevent war. And it is our conviction that all but a few of them realize that fact to the full, no matter how they regard it.

And many politicians and a lot of the newspapers may view the draft. Obviously there are any number of registrants who should not be separated from their civilian responsibilities for purposes of military training in any such adjustment as the present one.

The Fullest Last Days. Several times the Herald has expressed the belief that in Presidential campaigns no votes are won for either side in the last week. That is a considered opinion, the result of a great many years of experience with political campaigns. It is not arrived at without due consideration to the fact that there is, in our national history, a single instance where an inconceivably stupid blunder, made under circumstances that could hardly ever repeat themselves, probably did lose an elec-

tion to the Republican party in the very last days of a campaign. It was just forty-four years ago yesterday that a clergyman, Rev. Samuel D. Burchard, advocating the election as President of James G. Blaine, the Republican nominee, and speaking in the presence of the candidate, himself made what has been recognized ever since as the champion "boner" of American political history by denouncing the Democratic party as the party of "Rim, Romanism and Rebellion."

Mr. Blaine was probably the most brilliant campaigner of his time and quick as a flash on the uptake. He was well known to have the favor of great numbers of Catholic voters who were ordinarily Democrats, owing to certain circumstances which do not need to be gone into. Normally he would have been on his feet in an instant with a devastating denunciation of this insulting reference to the Catholic church. But he had been making a grueling campaign for six days before the election, went out over his wits and, in the excitement of the moment, he said: "Rim, Romanism and Rebellion."

Thousands of Blaine votes went to the Democrats. The vote of the great state of New York decided that election and Governor Cleveland carried it by something like 1,500 votes like that has happened, however, in any of the thirteen Presidential elections that have intervened between that one and the present one. ### Local Order Numbers Of Draft Are Given

Additional Names Are Published, Enough to Cover Drawings Here For Considerable Time

The Herald is today publishing the local order numbers of the draft. These numbers are published in order to cover drawings here for a considerable time, possibly for the entire period call for 800,000 men.

Local Order Numbers

These numbers are listed in accordance with local order numbers. Local order numbers are the only numbers that affect Massachusetts. For example, a National order number might be 350, yet the local order number is 145. National order numbers can run as high as 1,000, but Massachusetts order numbers run as high as 318 which is the total number of registrants in the area here.

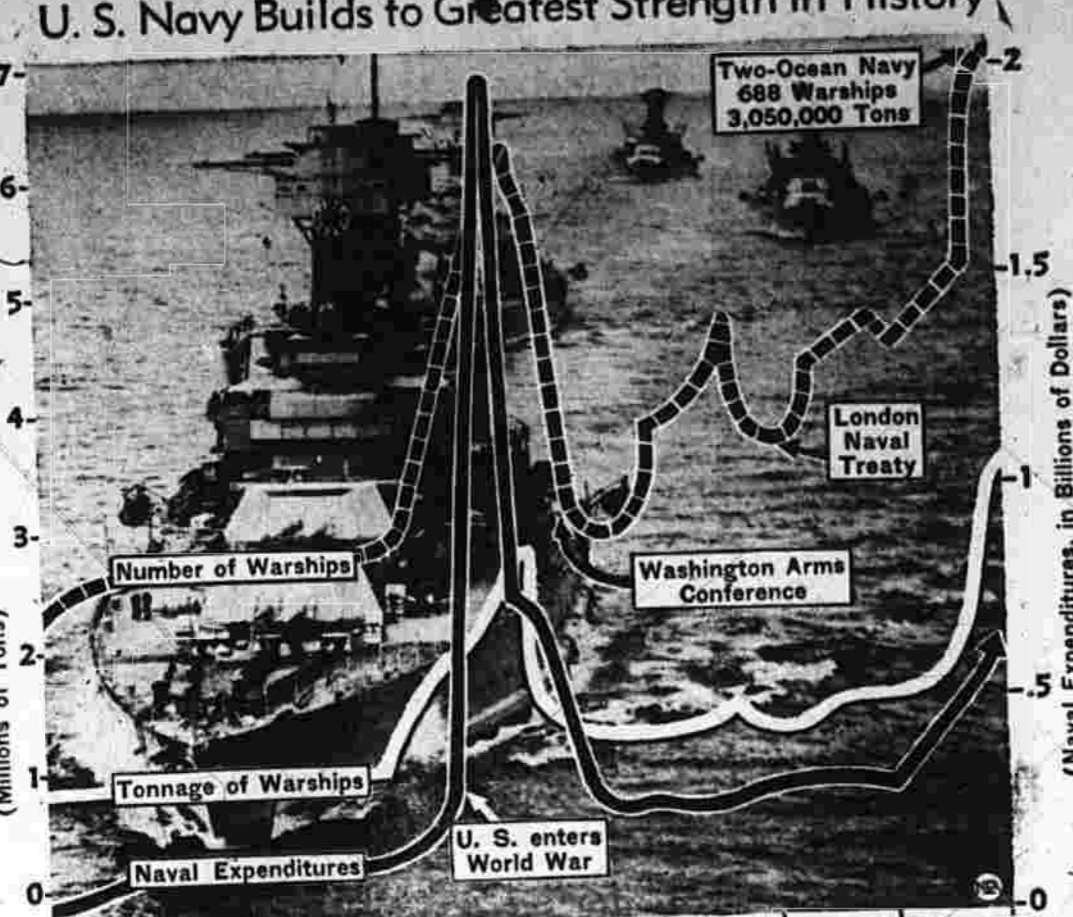
